This photograph was taken in the summer of 1944 or 1945. Mike Paglia is driving the caterpillar pulling the dummy.

The dummy was made by Stephen Knudson, age 5 or 6, and Rose Paglia, age 4 or 5, by stuffing sheep wool into old clothing. (Rose remembers crying when the dummy was burned!)

Stephen Knudson's father, John, was on the third horse and it may be his mother, Ruth on the second horse following the cat.

The parade was, Mike believes, a 100 year celebration of the town of Albion. The parade is traveling south on Main Street almost to Brown Street, going past what was Keeler's Grocery store in the Odd Fellow's building. The lot where the old Casey's is was then occupied by Gib Turner's Black Smith Shop as seen in the back ground.

Note the gravel and dirt street.
