

Assistant Is Authorized For Soils District

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The Davis County Soil Conservation District has received approval for hiring a local man to assist the district technicians in planning and laying out of soil conservation practices on Davis county farms, Dale Blackwell, chairman of the district commissioners, announced today.

At the present time, Leland McCord, soil conservation technician at the Bloomfield office, has one assistant who is helping to get soil practices established on the land, he said. The local office also employs an office assistant.

The last Iowa State legislature appropriated \$250,000 for assistance to soil conservation districts in getting their job done. Many other districts are also planning to enlarge the district staff, and will use some of this appropriated money to pay for more help.

Anyone who is interested in applying for this position should contact Leland McCord at the Soil Conservation district office at the northwest corner of the square in Bloomfield or Dale Blackwell, chairman of the district commissioners. It is necessary that applicants have a high school education, and a farm background, also a genuine desire to assist in getting more soil conservation established in Davis county.

The employment of another man in the soil conservation office here will help materially in getting more soil conservation on the land in Davis county, Blackwell said.
