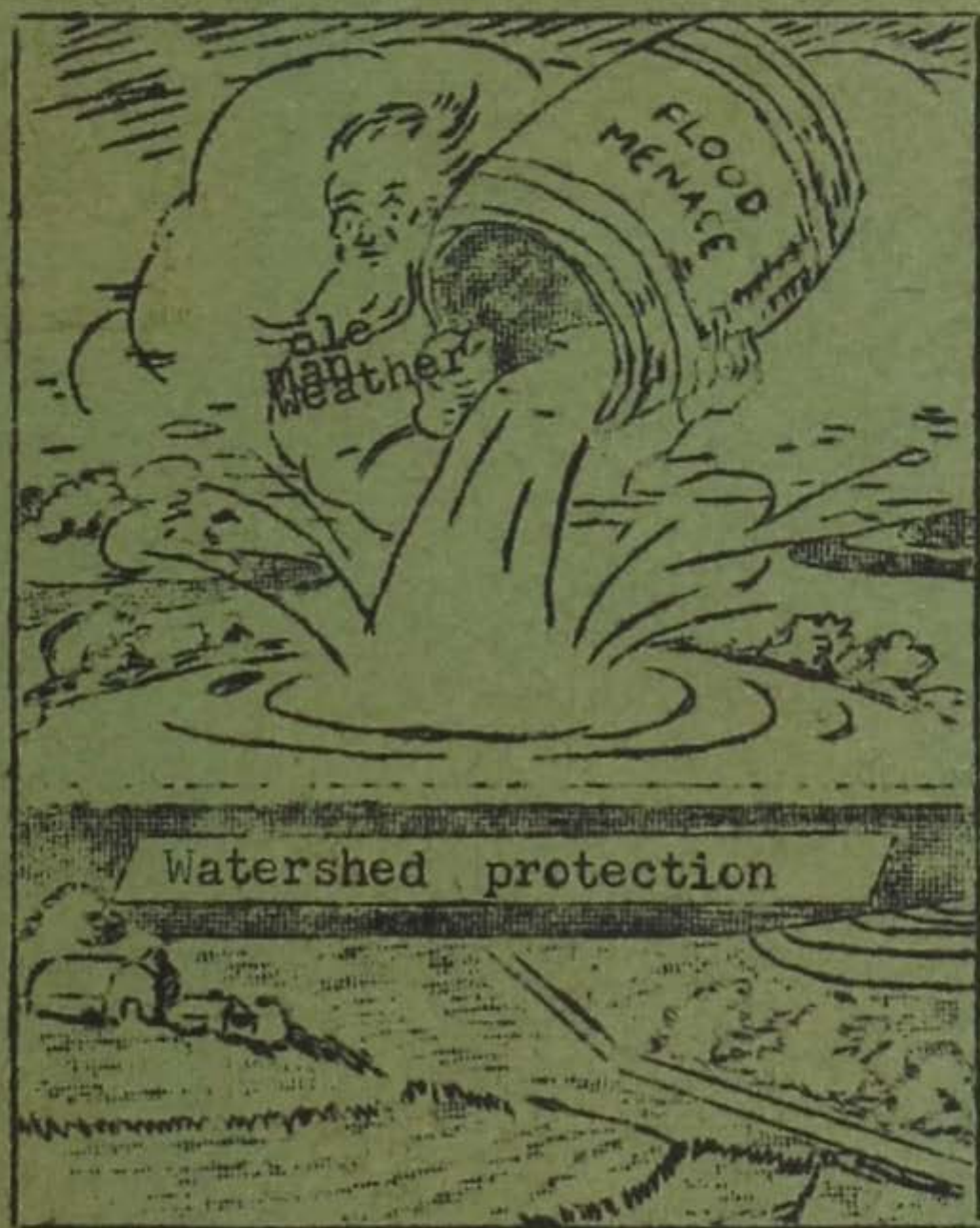

BIG WYACONDAH WATERSHED

- The Big Wyacondah Watershed Construction work got into full swing in 1964. Part II with Robert McConnell and Henry Burgher as contractors was completed June 30, 1964. This included structures on the farms of Aura Barnett, Dale Dixon, Frank Shively and a road riser below the structure on Dale Dixon. This contract cost was \$17,006.40.

Part III bids were opened May 13, 1964; the contract was awarded to J. C. Whisler for \$17,125.89; and the work was completed August 11, 1964. There were two structures built on the farms of Dean Grim and O. J. Scott and structural waterway work was done on the Lee Shelton farm.

Purchase orders were awarded to Bruce Harryman, Jr. for Part II and III Vegetative Seeding on September 10, 1964 and he completed work September 30, 1964 at a cost of \$3734.20.

September 25, 1964 bids were opened for Part IV and the contract was awarded to Albert Liles and F. H. Boyd for \$25,636.25. They started work at Site 45 on the Edward Burchette farm, October 26, 1964. Part IV also included structures to be built on the Richard McClurg, Otis Hutchings, and Albert Whisler farms.

On October 15, 1964 bids were opened for Part I, a drop box culvert located on the county road west of the Wesley Chapel church.

Plans are being made to let another contract involving 4 or 5 structures yet this year.

Surveys have been completed for the structures that will be built in 1965.
