

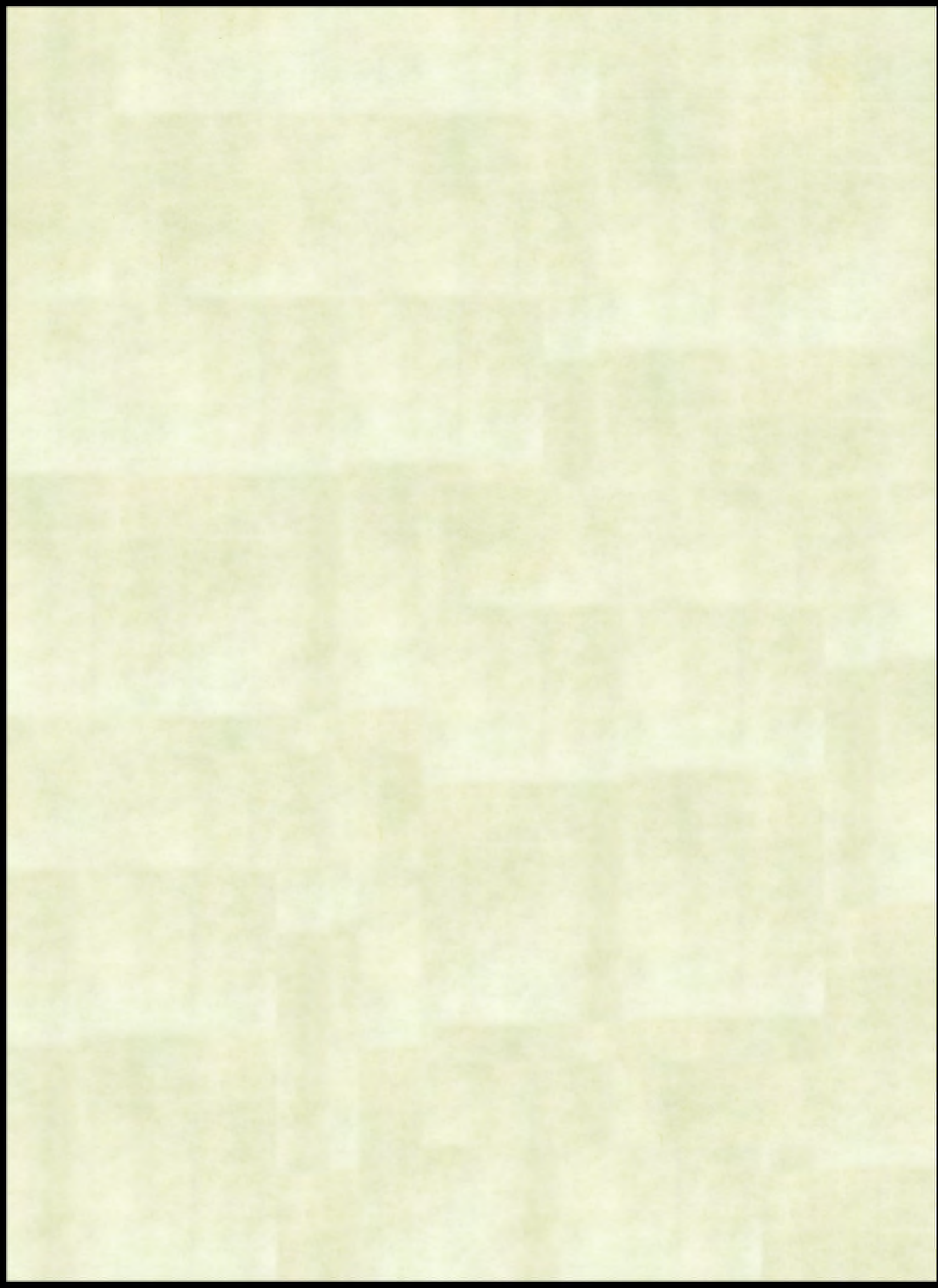

The Lane Report, which was filed and adopted as policy by the Board of Education this fall, promises to provide a bright future for Ottumwa High School. The report, directed by Dr. Willard R. Lane of the University of Iowa, is entitled, "Ottumwa Schools and the Challenge of Change."

Among other recommendations is a plan of action for keeping OHS' educational program up to date and providing adequate facilities for students. Suggested changes range from increasing the foreign language program to building a new high school in a centralized location.

Act to Improve and Expand Key Areas

Improvement and expansion in several school areas keynote administrative action this year. Business education facilities have been improved, and a new biology lab and program have been provided. Emphasis has been placed on expanding the library and modernizing the cafeteria; in addition, a convenient new business office was established early this year.

As chief administrator of Ottumwa High School, Principal Lewis E. Dye has many responsibilities. He feels the foremost one is to provide the best educational program possible. This requires careful supervision and evaluation of the curriculum and faculty. To help attain this goal, he hires efficient staff members and office personnel.

Informing the public, the Board of Education, and the superintendent of the progress of the var-

ious courses and activities at OHS is also an important duty of the principal. Numerous other tasks demand Mr. Dye's attention, such as observing classes and teachers, supervising extra-curricular activities, planning and ordering new equipment, and overseeing school maintenance.

Mr. Richard Geith, vice principal, serves the students in many ways. Although his most important duty is assisting the principal, student concerns run a close second. Discipline, as well as school enrollment, transfers, and attendance, falls under his direction. He often helps arrange a student's employment, in addition to providing work permits for qualified youths. Mr. Geith is responsible for sophomore orientation and supervision of the halls and cafeteria. He sponsors the Little Six Advisory and Hall Reserves.

Trained Counselors Provide Variety of Guidance Services

Guidance services are available to all students at Ottumwa High School. Members of the faculty supplement guidance services offered by the counselors, who are specially trained to help students with guidance needs and problems related to school and personal matters. The counselors do not provide the solutions to problems. They do, however, guide decisions on high school courses, post-graduate training, and occupational plans as well as help students improve their grades and resolve various personal problems. Through private or group counseling situations they are able to serve the students' best interests.

Commercial Classes Expand and Diversify

Newest sections in the commercial department this year are vocational office and retail education. Other commercial classes are typing, short-hand, business arithmetic, business law, and book-keeping.

The office training class has a new room and new equipment. The class is made up of 24 stations, each having an L-shaped desk and posture chair. There are also new IBM electric typewriters, printing calculators, and IBM voice writing machines. The students work in offices for half the school day.

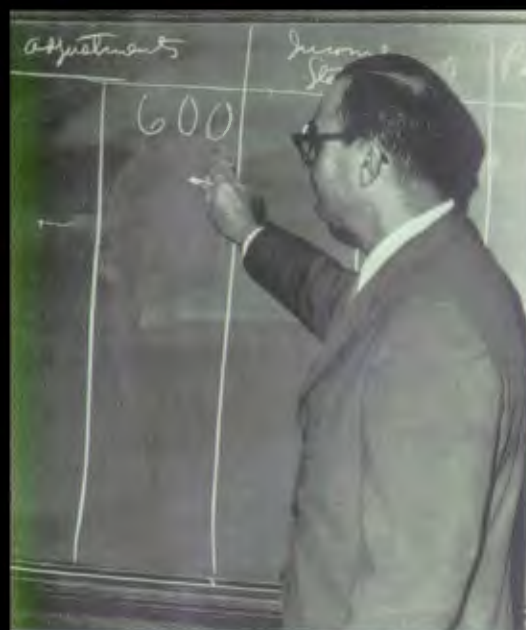
The retail training class, in the vocational school, prepares students for retail selling. They learn such skills as counter displaying, advertising, and shelf displaying. This class also lasts for half a day.

social studies department participates in the core track program, which offers excellent opportunities for team teaching. Students with reading difficulties are placed together in classes where they study history and English on their own reading levels and are given help with their reading problems. Teachers who take part in this program are John Anderson of the English department, Billie Lowe of the social studies department and Maxine Workman, who gives help in reading.

Music and Art Blend in Harmony

"I lay my harp on the curved table, sitting there idly." Unlike the poet's harpist, the OHS fine arts department has not been idle.

In addition to traditional concerts, festivals, and other public performances, highlights of the year for the music department included a two-day tour of Iowa high schools for band members and the madrigal's trip to Kansas City to sing for the 1966 National Convention of the American Choral Directors Association.

The art class prepared for the art show at the Pickwick Library and worked to improve the art in the school halls.

Many OHS students take part in these activities. The band has 195 members and the orchestra, 60 members. In addition, about 250 students take part in the choral program, and 140 students enjoy art classes.

Versatility is the key to the members of the fine arts department. Their many and varied activities consist of golf, symphony orchestra, art, hunting, fishing, history, coin-collecting, reading, church work, and photography. These many-faceted teachers are Jack Cameron, who directs the Sophomore and Junior-Senior Concert Bands and sponsors the marching bands, pep bands, and ensembles; Leland DeMoss, who teaches Art I, II, and III and guides the talented hands of the Art Club; Dean Olson, who conducts the Orchestra, drills the Sophomore Marching Band and sponsors the ever-popular stage band; and Jack Trautwein, who leads in sweet song the Concert Choir, Sophomore Mixed Chorus, Sophomore Glee Club, Treble Choir, and Madrigal.

Languages Teach World-wide Communication

Laboratories are not always for chemistry students. This year, for the first time, language labs, including tapes, earphones, and controls, are being used by the French classes. Speaking is emphasized the first year. During the second, verb forms used in the spoken language and the basis for compound tenses are taught.

The Spanish classes are aided by tape recorders. Emphasis is put on speaking during the first year and on grammar in the second.

The successful standard course continues to be used by the Latin classes.

Ten Counties Sponsor Area Technical School

Plans are being made for a new industrial arts and vocational training center, under the auspices of Tenco, to be established at the Ottumwa Air Base next year. This school will be open to students from ten countries in this area.

The present two-year program consists of industrial and vocational training. The first year is exploratory and consists of such courses as auto mechanics, printing, machine shop, welding, and woodworking. The second year is taken by those selected students who wish to become proficient in their chosen fields, and post-graduate training is received at the technical school at the air base.

In addition, three years of drafting, including mechanical drawing and architectural drawing, are offered. A fourth post-graduate year in these areas is also given at the technical school.

Boys stress physical fitness through weight lifting, which strengthens muscle tone.



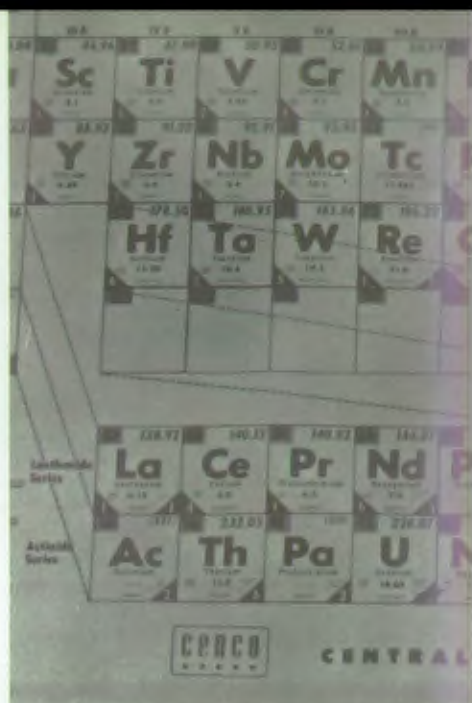
Science Interest Skyrockets

Politics, Notre Dame, travel, athletics, antiques, automobiles, and reading are just a few of the interests of the social studies faculty. These instructors are Stephen Augspurger who teaches U.S. history; Robert Beisch, who teaches U.S. history and sponsors the debate team and Future Teachers of America; Florence Fast, instructor in world history; John Frost, modern problems teacher; James Humphrey, who teaches U.S. history and coaches the golf team; John Killian, modern problems instructor; Billie Lowe, who teaches world history; Mike McWilliams, teacher of modern problems and business law and swimming team coach; John Potter, who teaches world geography and directs the audio-visual club in their activities; Robert Roth, who teaches modern problems; James Streeby, modern problems and U.S. history teacher; Ronald Utech, U.S. history teacher and co-sponsor of the Future Teachers of America; Robert Vander Linden who teaches world history and coaches football and weight-lifting; Harvey Ware, psychology instructor; and Robert Warren, who is a world history instructor and cross-country and assistant basketball and track coach.

During the school year of 1965-1966, the social studies department has been considering changes in the present courses. Modern problems and U.S. history are to be completely revised while world history is to have changes made in the course. The possibility of more electives is being considered because the only electives at the present time are psychology, a one-semester course for seniors, and world geography, a two-semester subject for juniors.

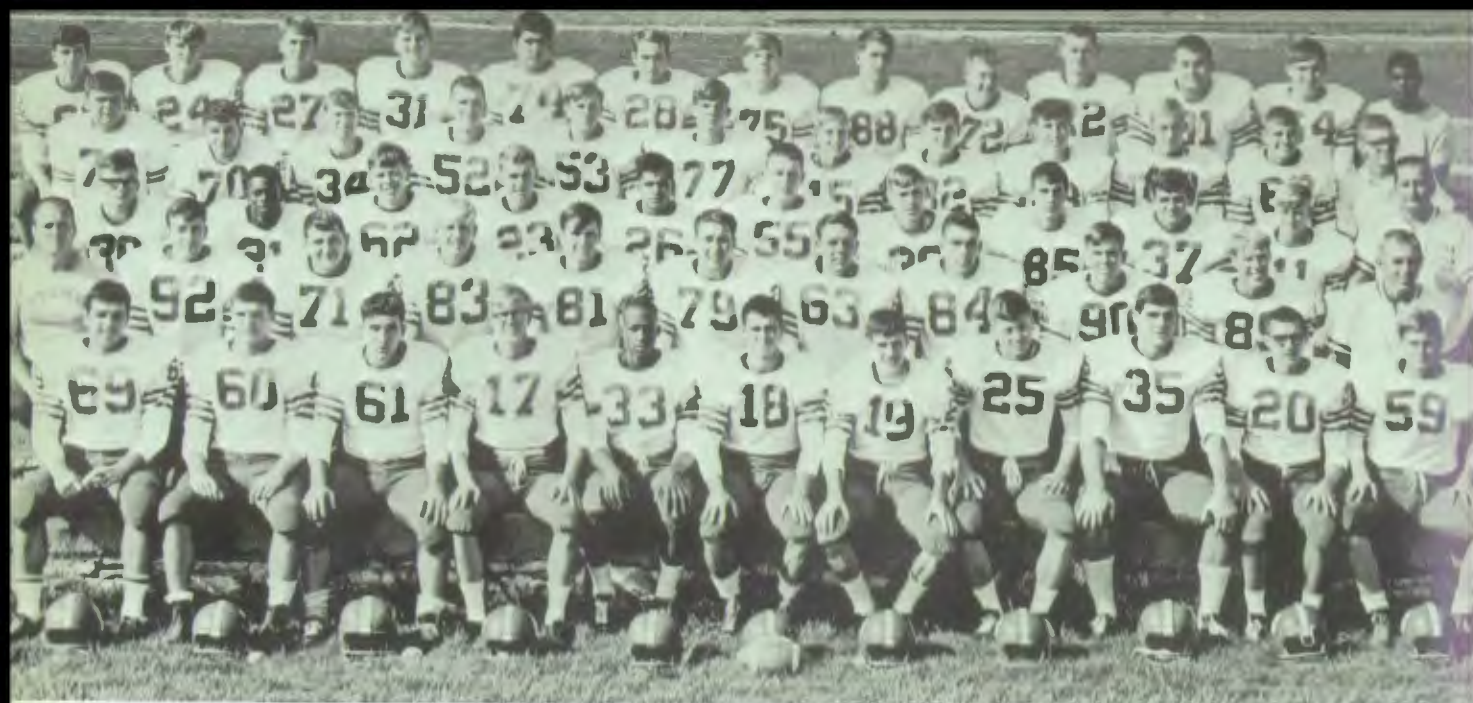

Prospects for the coming season look brighter than this year's 4-5 record, Coach Vander Linden feels, because the junior varsity downed Iowa City, Fairfield, and Russell, losing only a second match with Fairfield. He has challenged this year's juniors to better the record set by the varsity.

Ottumwa at Regis, September 18 . . . Defeat first came at the hands of Cedar Rapids Regis. The second quarter proved critical as Regis capitalized on a pass interception and a fumble recovery to score twice. Despite a steady downpour throughout the second half, the Bulldogs came back to display a much improved offense, but were unable to make up the first half deficit, and went down to defeat 21-7.

Muscatine at Ottumwa, September 24 . . . In their first Conference battle of the season, the Bulldogs rolled over outmanned Muscatine 26-7, in a game which undoubtedly would have been a shut-out, had it not been for a freak play in the final 3½ minutes when the Bulldogs blocked their own punt. Larry Hart's punt from the 37-yd. line accidentally hit Randy Greiner in the back, bounced straight up in the air and was retrieved by a Muscatine end who dashed into the end zone for the Muskies' sole TD of the night.

Assumption at Ottumwa, October 1 . . . The Bulldogs did their best to give fans a Homecoming victory, but suffered instead a 13-0 loss to Davenport Assumption, their first in Little Six competition. Both teams made numerous mistakes but the Knights cashed in on more of their opportunities. They seemed able to make the most of each Bulldog mistake. Assumption coaches credited much of their success to intensive scouting.

Ottumwa at Keokuk, October 8 . . . Statistics pointed to an impressive win for OHS, but four costly fumbles ruined an otherwise outstanding Bulldog performance. Three of them came in the first half and Ottumwa left the field clinging to a one point lead. In the third quarter the Bulldogs fumbled again and Keokuk went ahead. Ottumwa fought back to a 19-19 tie but was unable to regain the lead as the Purple Chiefs made it 25-19 with just 3½ minutes of play remaining.

Fairfield at Ottumwa, October 15 . . . Minutes before game time half of Schaefer Stadium was suddenly plunged into darkness. Forty minutes later electricians were able to restore the power and the game began. Until late in the third quarter, the Bulldogs maintained only a shaky 7-0 lead. Then with unexpected suddenness they exploded and in just two minutes expanded their lead to 19 points. They scored a final time and defeated the Trojans 25-0, Ottumwa's sixth consecutive win over Fairfield.

Burlington at Ottumwa, October 22 . . . With 4½ minutes left to play and the score tied 13-13, stunned Bulldog fans watched as the Greyhounds marched 64 yards. Tension gave way to heartbreak as Burlington, battled every step of the way by determined Bulldogs, pushed into the end zone to score a tie-breaking TD with only 29 seconds left on the clock. Once again the traditional doghouse was ours.

Ottumwa at Bettendorf, October 29 . . . "The Bulldogs played well enough to win. Why they didn't is somewhat of a mystery." So said the Ottumwa Courier of October 30, in describing a severely frustrating 7-6 loss. Statistically, the Bulldogs were overwhelmingly superior; doubling the first downs and nearly doubling the yardage gained by Bettendorf. But the game went into the record books as Ottumwa's fourth loss of the year in Conference competition and doomed the Bulldogs to fifth place in the Little Six.

Oskaloosa at Ottumwa, November 5 . . . Twenty-six OHS seniors ended their high school football careers in classic fashion as the Bulldogs massacred the Oskaloosa Indians 40-0, in what coaches and sportswriters termed the best offensive show of the season. It was a revenge-satisfying night for the Bulldogs, and a fitting finale for a team which everyone agreed was much better than the scores alone would indicate. Figures may not lie, but neither do they tell the whole story.

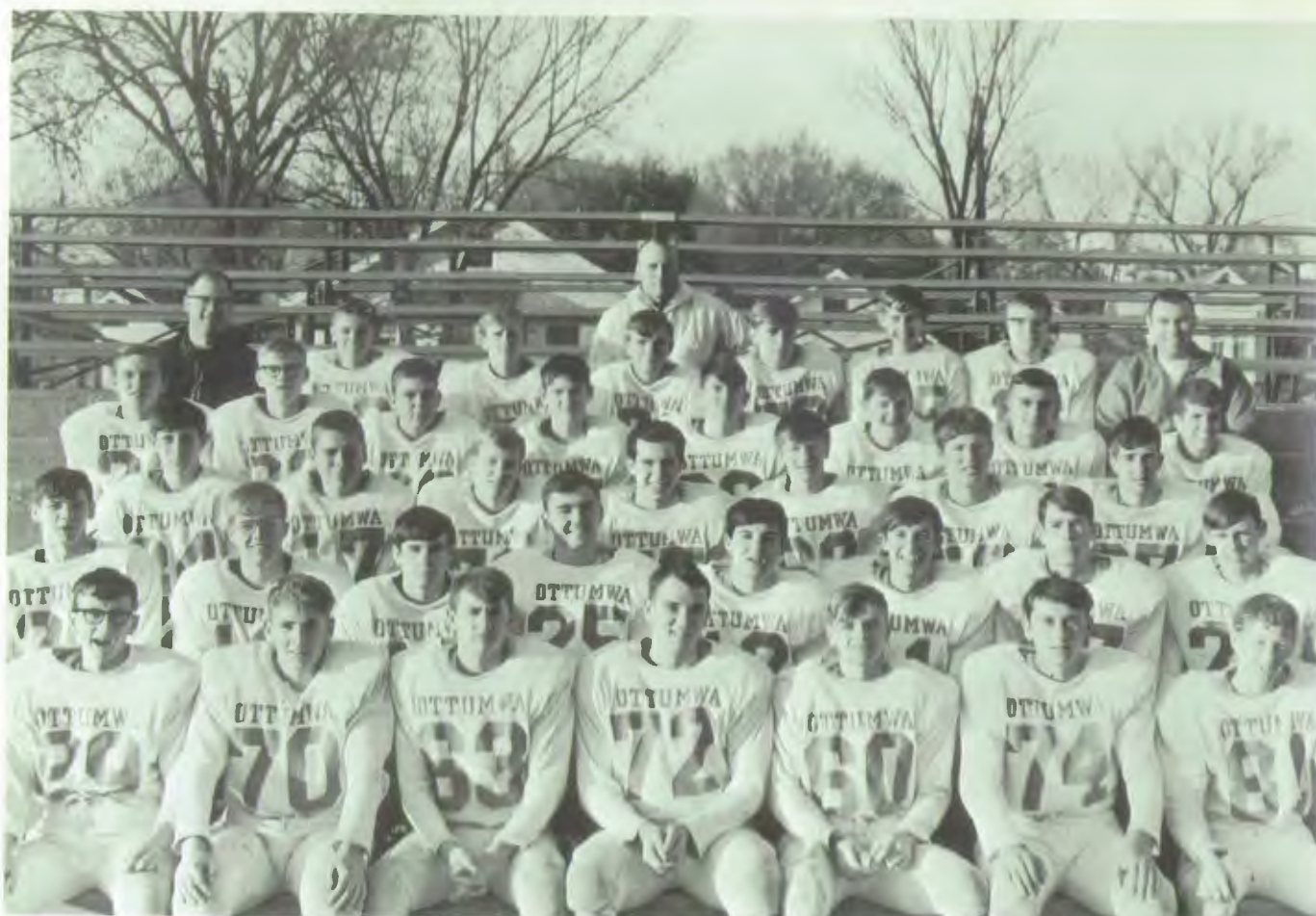

"Ottumwa High has never been represented by a more scrappy, hustling, battling and courageous team."

So said Alan Hoskins, assistant sports editor of the *Ottumwa Courier*. And Ottumwans couldn't agree more. The 1965-66 Bulldogs played each of the top three teams in the State, and never once gave up the fight until the horn had emitted its final ear-piercing blast.

In the regular season of seventeen games, the Bulldogs could get only four wins, and were without a victory in the Little Six. But scores, alone, seem insignificant in the face of such grim determination and intense desire to win.

The possession of such a fighting spirit would be enough to make any team a stunning moral success, however, Coach Bill Kramer's Bulldogs can lay claim to a number of tangible honors as well. They racked up a total of 1,116 points in regular season play, to become the second highest scoring team in OHS history. The entire starting lineup, Larry Hart, Sam Swaim, Ron Simpson, Larry Goepel, and Dennis Dougherty, was named to the Little Six Honor Roll.

But the climax came when the Bulldogs ripped loose in the District Tournament. They rolled over Van Buren; edged past Walsh in a double overtime, one of the greatest and most exciting games Ottumwa has ever seen; and downed Fairfield by a substantial margin, to become the District champions, the first OHS title winners since 1963.

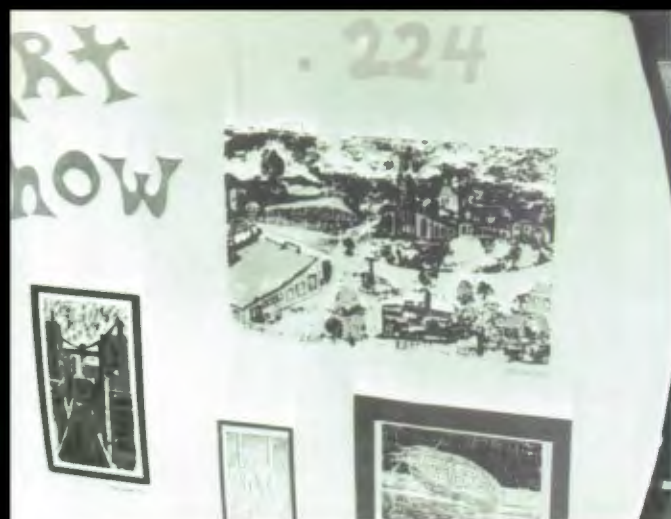

John Bakayana is the foreign exchange student this year. He is from Uganda, East Africa. The students of O.H.S. enjoy John's quiet ways and his musical talents. He has written the following impressions of Ottumwa:

The name, "United States of America," didn't reach my ears until I was in the sixth grade and it took me quite a while to learn to say it. In November of 1964, when I was chosen to participate in the AFS winter program, I looked forward to seeing the country the name of which had presented a problem to me when I first tried to say it. I had studied about such places as New York, Chicago, the Middle West, corn-growing areas, etc., in my geography classes. The desire of seeing them grew bigger and bigger within me.

First I realized that I had to get used to the language, people, and food. The language wasn't new to me but it included a lot of slang that I wasn't used to. However, it didn't take me too long to catch on.

The first week I was in Ottumwa I thought it would take me quite a while to get used to the people as well as the place. But, it wasn't so. I think this was because the people were so friendly and sweet to me that I was enjoying myself every minute.

When school started I was fascinated by the number of students. I had never attended a school with so many students. It was quite interesting to see them hurrying before and after every class.

At first, when I saw kids dance, I thought they were just crazy. Some were shaking their heads as though the devils were sitting on them, while others were bouncing about on the floor like super-balls. I couldn't make any sense out of it. I later started taking shares (or part) in them. By and by, I learned to do the bird, swim, etc.

Autumn presented a wonderful scene to me when the leaves turned yellow, brown, red, and many other colors. Oh! it was beautiful! But the winter made the trees look so ugly and lifeless that I could hardly remember their beauty that I had seen in autumn. Generally, I didn't like winter very much. I liked the snow and it was quite an experience for me to see it snowing and walk and slide on it, but I hated the cold weather.

My life in Ottumwa became more exciting when I started visiting with different groups of people. It was interesting to answer all sorts of questions and to learn what people in the U.S. think of Africa.

I would like to thank the teachers, students, and the people of Ottumwa for their great hospitality. I hope to enjoy the rest of my stay here much more than the past and when I go home never will I forget you.

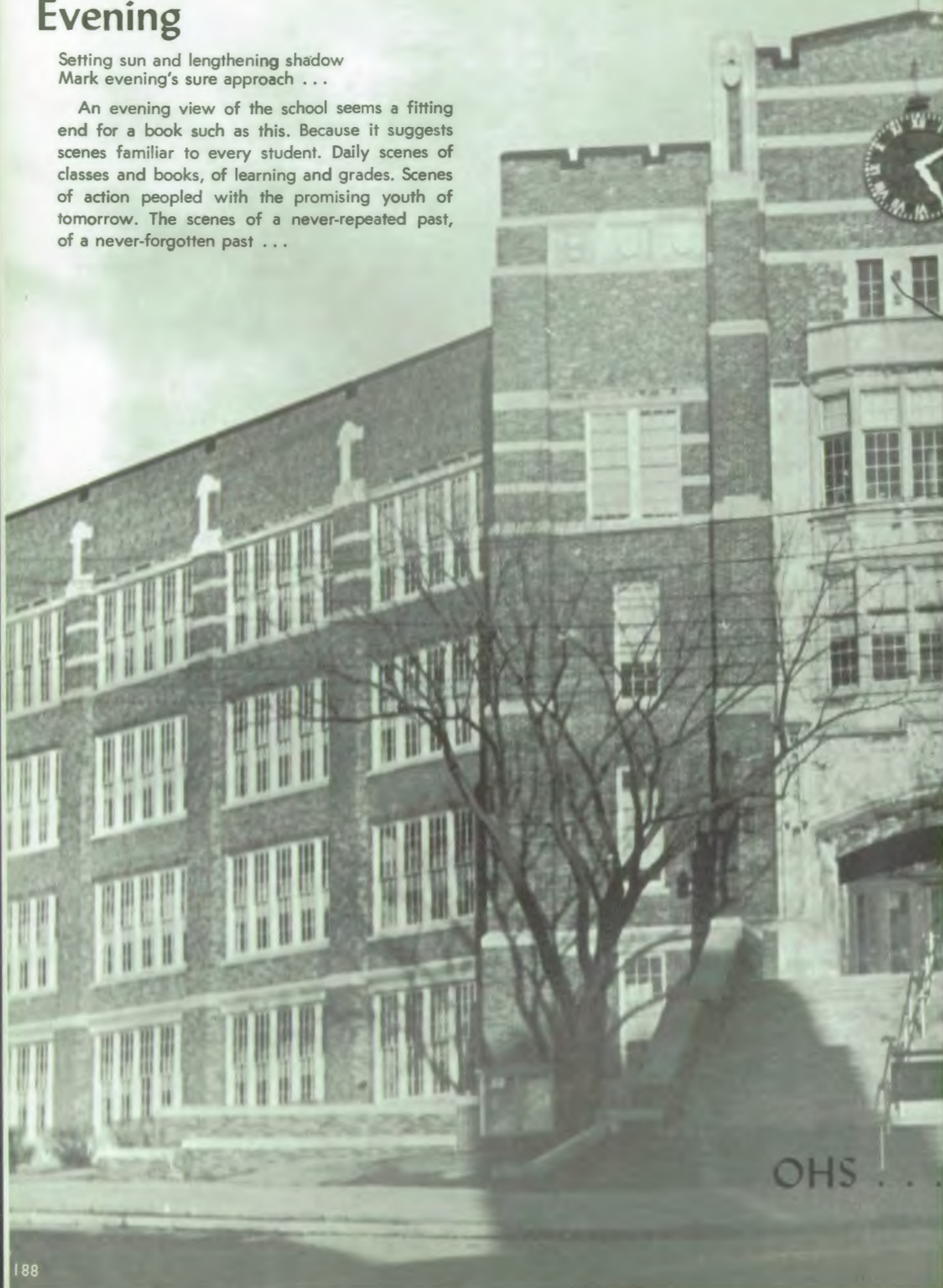
