DOG BARK CAUSES A SERIOUS RUNAWAY

**Members of W. C. Hilleman's
Family Have a Very
Narrow Escape**

**Were Coming to Town Satur-
day Night—Daughter
has Arm Broken**

While coming to town Saturday evening, W. C. Hilleman and family, who live three miles northeast of this place, narrowly escaped being killed outright. As they neared the George Nolte farm, a mile and one-half north of town, the dog on the place ran out in the darkness, his continual barking frightening the team Mr. Hilleman was driving and starting the horses down the hill on a run. For some reason one of the tugs of the harness became unfastened, letting the neckyoke down. When the bridge at the foot of the cemetery hill was reached the tongue of the buggy caught in the railing, releasing the team, turning the vehicle completely over and throwing the occupants out.

With Mr. Hilleman at the time of the accident were his wife and children, Mildred and Harold; his brother, Harvey, young son of Mr. and Mrs. F. A. Hilleman; and Miss Nora Kuhns, of Nauvoo, Illinois, who is visiting the family.

Mildred, who has had her arm broken twice before, was the most seriously hurt of all. Her left collar bone was broken in two places and the arm was fractured just below the shoulder, the ends of the bones being quite badly shattered. It is also feared that she was hurt internally. Her little brother received a slight bump on his forehead and her father was badly bruised on the face. The other occupants of the car escaped unharmed, aside from the jar and the scare.

Mildred was taken to the Nolte home, where her wounds were dressed and Sunday morning she was brought to town to the home of her grandparents, Mr. and Mrs. F. A. Hilleman, where she now is. She is a great suf-

ferer from the intense pains, but the worst of it is there is danger of her arm being stiff, which would be a great calamity in view of the fact that she gives promise of becoming a talented musician.

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TWO HURT IN RUNAWAY

Bad Accident Near State Center Saturday Night Results in Painful Injury to Little Mildred Hilleman—Girl's Father Also Hurt When Dog Frightens Horses and Buggy Overturns.

Wilbert Hilleman, a farmer living three and one-half miles northeast of State Center, and his little daughter Mildred were both injured, the latter very painfully, when the Hilleman team ran away Saturday night at about 7 o'clock as the Hillemans were driving to State Center. The little girl's injuries consist of a fracture of the collar bone, shoulder blade, and arm at a point two inches below the shoulder. Mr. Hilleman was badly bruised about the head and face, and his son Harold sustained slight bruises.

In the Hilleman rig were Mr. and Mrs. Hilleman, their son and daughter, Harvey Hilleman, a brother of Mr. Hilleman, and Miss Clara Kuhn, of Nauvoo, Ill. When the rig was opposite the George Nolta place, a mile and a half north of State Center, the Nolta dog ran out, barking at the horses. This frightened the team, which started to

THREE DAY CAMPAIGN BRINGS 36 ENTRIES INTO STATE CONTEST

County Organization Perfected
With Aid of State Organizer
Rex Yockey of Ames

A successful campaign to organize Marshall county farm boys and girls into a baby beef feeding club was closed Wednesday forenoon after a visit to the local high school by the State Organizer, Mr. Rex Yockey, of the extension department at Ames.

Mr. Yockey could only be secured for a three day campaign in Marshall county and owing to the limited time only a small part of Marshall county could be covered, but the club was practically assured the first day of the campaign when 24 boys and girls enrolled from Minerva township. Thru the kindness and cooperation of Pres. W. N. Gilbert of the Central State bank quite a large amount of territory was covered in the short time, which added much to the success of the organization work.

The first day's trip was made among the schools and farms of Minerva township. At school No. 8, taught by Miss Emma Armbricht, three boys, Ray Eckhardt, Herman Eggers and Elvan Hartwig entered the club. The first girl to enter was Miss Mildred Hilleman who was enrolled at School No. 7, taught by Miss Ruth Figgins. Miss Hilleman's brother, Harold, also enrolled and a lively contest between brother and sister is promised. Delos Lane, another pupil at No. 7, was also enrolled.

Meier Rites Held in State Center

Funeral services for Clarence G. Meier, 73, State Center, were held at 10:30 a.m. Wednesday at St. Paul Lutheran Church and burial was in Hillside Cemetery. The Rev. L. R. Meinecke officiated.

Mr. Meier died Sunday, June 16 in Marshalltown Area Community Hospitals. He had been in failing health for two months and had previously been hospitalized in Iowa City before being admitted Sunday morning in Marshalltown.

Active pallbearers were Robert Lane, Larry Honeck, John Sparks, Don Lane, Louie Smith and Rufus Conkin.

Honorary pallbearers were Alvin Gerke, Ferd Mehlisch, Ralph Pfantz, Raymond Pfantz, Walter Henze and Ferd Westphal. Wensel-Perrin Funeral Home was in charge of arrangements.

Mr. Meier was born Mar. 6, 1901 in Clemons, son of Herman and Alvina Richerodt Meier. The family

moved to Madelia, Minn., where he received his education before returning to State Center in 1919.

On Nov. 25, 1925, he married Mildred Hilleman in State Center and was employed on farms near State Center. They established their home on a farm north of State Center in 1936 and moved to town upon retiring in 1965. He was a member of St. Paul's Lutheran Church.

Survivors include his widow; two daughters, Mrs. Charles (Dorene) Lampkin and Mrs. Howard (Irene) Riemenschneider, State Center; and two sons, Robert Meier, Westminster, Colo., and Roger Meier, Tucson, Ariz. Also surviving are seven grandchildren, three great grandchildren, and a brother, Walter Meier, State Center Manor.
