Henry first became an employe of the State Center Light Plant in 1921 and was superintendent for 16 years prior to his resignation on July 22, 1944. It was under his direction and supervision that the present profitable system was installed from a point where the town of State Center was without commercial credit, and he recalls that at one time he worked three months before he was able to draw a salary check. He was a private in the army motor transportation corps. in World War I.

The baptismal certificate names him "Heinrich Christoph Wilhelm Wilkening" born 20th January 1896 State Center Iowa; baptized 3 March 1896 at St. Pauls Lutheran, State Center, Iowa. She was preceded in death by her husband on Jan, 13, 1975; a son, Dwight; a great-grandson, Steven Weuve, four sisters and three brothers.

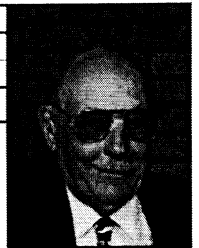
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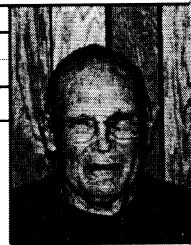

Homer lived in Marshall County the majority of his life after his parents returned to Iowa from California in 1920. He went to first grade in a country school on West Main St., second grade in the Franklin School, and finished through most of his ninth grade year in Melbourne. In March 1932 he left school to help his father on the dairy farm near Marshalltown. After he and Marion married in 1938 he spent the next three to four years farming at several locations on the east and west sides of Marshalltown. He worked for several local contractors and home builders from 1941 to 1947 as a laborer and carpenter. During this period he spent one year in 1945 serving in the US Army and going through basic training at Camp Walters, Texas (near Fort Worth). In 1947, while he was a journeyman carpenter with Con Jacobson, he built his first house on South First Street, near High Street. From there he was hooked in the home construction and development business. During the next 38 years, 1947 to 1985, "Harrison Homes" built over 2,000 homes and developed nine subdivisions in Marshalltown. Later in their career, between 1971 and 1989, he and Marion ran an antique dealership, "Granny's Antiques", on Highway 30, near South 12th St. Homer and Marion decided to leave their friends and relatives and move to Kokomo, Indiana in May, 1993 to be closer to their children and grandchildren.

Homer's primary cause of death (per death certificate) was Hypoxemia (low oxygen in the blood); his other causes were Chronic Obstructive Pulmonary Disease (COPD) and bilateral pulmonary fibrosis. A significant contributing conditions contributing to death was myocardial infraction, coronary artery disease (heart attack).

Homer had his first heart attack on 11/5/08 when he had his first three stents. His second heart attack occurred on 2/16/09. He took 4 nitro pills, then he was admitted to the hospital upon sharing pain information with Sharon on 2/17. Three more stents were put in his heart the evening of 2/17. He was transferred to the extended care unit of the hospital on 2/25 with the focus on being discharged to his home when he regained sufficient strength to care for himself. He was re-admitted to the main hospital on 3/2 when he was having great trouble breathing and his lung condition was made apparent to his family. There was hope at that time that he may be moved back to the extended care unit within a couple of days. His lung condition continued to deteriorate making his breathing very difficult and taking much of his energy. He took his last breath on the evening of 3/5 and was officially pronounced dead at 11:00 PM.

The family moved to South 12th Avenue Road, about a mile south of highway 30. Upon graduation from LeGrand in 1958, Dick enrolled in the Marshall Community College for one year before entering Iowa State University in 1959. He graduated with a BSEE from Iowa State on May 26, 1962 and married Karen Patricia Goraczowski on the following day in Ames, Iowa. With their diplomas in their hand Dick and Karen moved to Waltham, Massachusetts to start their new careers.
