

County Soil Commissioner term to expire in January

The term of one Louisa County Soil and Water Conservation District Commissioner, Ramon Reutinger of Morning Sun, Marshall Township, will expire at noon on January 2, 1991. Successors will be elected at the general election on November 6, 1990.

Any qualified elector residing in the soil conservation district, which is all of Louisa County including cities and towns, is eligible for the office of commissioner, except that no more than one commissioner may be a resident of any one township.

Incumbent commissioners are Tom Utter of Columbus Junction, Concord Township; Olin Jennings, Columbus Junction, Columbus City Township; Martin Hoeg of Wapello, Wapello Township; and Leland Roudybush, Muscatine, Port Louisa Township. Therefore, residents of these townships would not be eligible for office at this time.

Prospective candidates seeking the

office of soil and water conservation district commissioner must file nomination petitions in the same manner as for other elective positions at the general election, except that no political party is designated. Nomination petitions can be obtained from the County Auditor.

These petitions, signed by 25 eligible electors, must be filed with the County Auditor at the Louisa County Courthouse no later than 5 p.m. on August 29, 1990.

Individuals elected in November 1990 will serve a term of six years commencing January 2, 1991. Soil and Water Conservation District Commissioners serve without salary and guide the overall soil and water conservation program in the county.
