

Contest on Wed. *Sept. 1962* For Miss Clyman

Kay Clyman, daughter of the Neal Clymans of Bloomfield, will be one of nine girls competing for the title of state Queen of Conservation in Atlantic next Wednesday.

Miss Clyman, a junior at Davis high school, won the right to compete for the state crown by being named the Davis county Queen of Conservation and then by winning the regional title at Fairfield.

Miss Clyman, 16, is active in several school activities and has been a member of girls 4-H for seven years. She has been county 4-H Queen, delegate to state 4-H conference, and has participated on a 4-H demonstration team at the state fair.

The contest will be held in conjunction with the Plowmen's Banquet at the 4-H and FFA community building in Atlantic. The new queen will reign as official hostess of the 1962 state Soil Conservation Districts field day and contour plowing match the following day. The queen will also receive a cash award of \$250.
