Henry Hilleman, an old and highly respected citizen of State Center township for many years, died after an illness of several months duration. Death was due to a complication of liver and kidney disease. He had been in ill health for more than a year and had been bedfast for the past month.

Mr Hilleman was a native of Germany, having been born at Hagenbeck, Brunswick April 21, 1834. He came to America at the age of 25 in a sailing vessel, lived for a year at St Louis and then moved to Kendall county, Illinois from where, after a residence of seven years, moved to this county and settled on a farm four and one half miles northwest of State Center. He lived there until ten years ago, when he moved into town.

Mr Hilleman was united in marriage April 23, 1865 to Miss Augusta Keunecke. She died August 11, 1894. Surviving their father are eleven of the twelve children born to Mr and Mrs Hilleman. They are Charly, Henry Jr, Albert, Louis, August, Ernest, William, M Emil, Eugene H. and Lena Hilleman, and Mrs Edward Eckhardt. Mrs Hilleman is also survived by twenty-six grandchildren.

Funeral services were held Monday forenoon at 11 o'clock at the Methodist church in this city, Rev Henry Markworth in charge of the services. Burial was made in Hillside cemetery.

Mr Hilleman died Sunday morning, May 13 in Marshalltown Area Community Hospital West.

He was born August 9, 1892, in State Center, the son of Carl and Alwine Yingst Hilleman. He was educated in the State Center schools and attended Highland Park College in Des Moines. He served in the U.S. Army.

On August 10, 1922 he married Emma Schlaman in Anamosa, Iowa. They were married by her father. They returned to State Center, where Mr Hilleman was in the John Deere Implement business. He retired in 1952.

CHARLES HILLEMANN, PIONEER RESIDENT, PASSES WEDNESDAY

**Passes On 77th Birthday:
Funeral Held On
Saturday**

Charles Hillemann, 77, prominent State Center farmer and long time resident of this community passed away Wednesday afternoon, September 23 at his home after suffering a heart attack last Friday. Mr. Hillemann had been in poor health for the past two years. His death occurred on his 77th birthday.

Funeral services were held Saturday afternoon at St. Paul's Lutheran Church at two o'clock with the Rev. H. P. Kumpf in charge. A prayer service at the home at one-thirty was also in charge of Rev. Kumpf. Burial was made in Hillside Cemetery. Pallbearers for the funeral were Arnold, Reuben, Roy, Ronald and Marvin Hillemann and Water E. Eckhardt.

Charles Hillemann was born September 23, 1865 on a farm near Plano, Ill., the eldest son of Hendy and Augusta Konecneke Hillemann. In March, 1866 they moved to Iowa settling on a farm northeast of State Center. The late Mr. Hillemann was baptized and confirmed in the Lutheran Church.

On December 10, 1891 he married Miss Minnie Hennis, who died on September 27, 1893. L. C. Hillemann local business man, was the only child of this marriage. Mr. Hillemann married Miss Henrietta Miller on Feb. 20, 1896 and she passed away March 11, 1927. To this union were born two children, Mrs. Florence Gue, Red Cross nurse at Manassa, Va., and G. M. Hillemann at home.

In addition to his children, Mr. Hillemann is survived by seven brothers and two sisters, Albert, Henry, August, Ernest, William and M. E. of State Center and Eugene Hillemann of Nevada; and Mrs. Edward Eckhardt and Miss Caroline Hillemann, both of State Center.

The deceased was a life long member of St. Paul's Lutheran Church.

RAYMOND U. HILLEMANN, PUBLIC HEALTH WORKER, PASSES IN FLORIDA

Raymond U. Hilleman, prominent public health worker and a native of the State Center community, died of Bright's disease last Saturday, September 9, at his home at Fort Lauderdale, Florida.

Funeral services were held today at 2:30 p. m. at the First Presbyterian Church in State Center with the Rev. E. R. Mitchell and the Rev. D. H. Middents of Fort Leavenworth, Kansas, officiating. Pall bearers were D. C. Hilleman, LeRoy Hilleman, Arnold Hilleman, Ronald Hilleman, Reuben Hilleman and Walter Eckhardt. Interment was in Hillside Cemetery.

Son of Henry and Verna Weuve Hilleman, he was born near State Center on November 22, 1901. He spent his early life in the State Center community, graduating from the State Center high school with the class of 1919. He later graduated from the University of Iowa with a bachelor's degree and then obtained his master's degree from the University of Chicago.

He had worked toward the degree of Ph. D. at Western Reserve University and New York University.

He was united in marriage to Miss Phyllis P. Johnson of Cleveland, Ohio at Winchester, Va., on October 28, 1933. They made their home at Rocky River, Ohio, for two years where Mr. Hilleman taught in the public schools. Later, he entered public health work at Cleveland and several years later he handled the same kind of service at Chicago. In 1947, they moved to Fort Lauderdale, Florida, where Mr. Hilleman operated an apartment hotel.

Through public health and organizational work in the field of tuberculosis, he was a member of the National Tuberculosis Association and was a member and advisor of the National Tuberculosis Secretaries Association.
