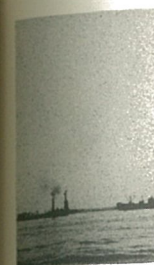




Pfc. CARL H. MANLY
Son of Mr. and Mrs. Clarence Manly, Solo, Mo.
Inducted April 9, 1941. Member of 34th Division, 168th
Infantry, Company E. Trained at Camp Claiborne,
Louisiana, and Fort Dix, New Jersey. Left for overseas
April 29, 1942. Taken prisoner February 17, 1943 in the
Battle of Faid Pass in North Africa. Was prisoner over
26 months. Liberated by Americans May 3, 1945, near
Lubbeck, Germany. Landed in New York, July 5, 1945.
Honorably Discharged September 23, 1945, at Hot Springs,
Arkansas.

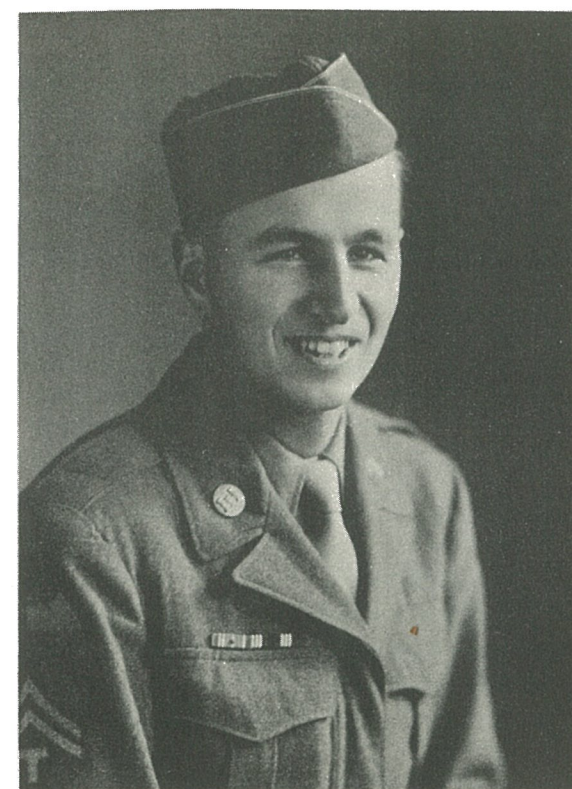

for overseas, February 5, 1945, landed in France and
moved up to the front, on to Check, Pilsen, back to Tackan,
Czechoslovakia, transferred to 4th Armored Division, 34th
Engineers Battalion, back to U. S.
Honorably Discharged March 15, 1946.



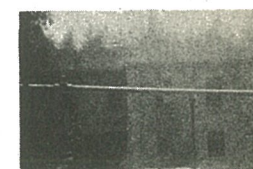
