

Delaware Co. Names Soil Commissioner

MANCHESTER, Ia. — Donald Eibey, Coffin's Grove Township farmer, has been named Delaware County Soil district commissioner for a six-year term to succeed Clifford C. Robinson of Masonville, who served a similar period.

Lyle V. Sutton of Delhi and Clifton Klaus of Colsburg are the other two commissioners, all of whom are charged with the responsibility of coordinating soil conservation efforts in Delaware County.

Rex Conn of Cedar Rapids gave the main address and stated that we are making progress in the field of soil conservation although at a slow rate. Conn feels optimistic about the future of soil conservation in that farmers eventually will be looked down on for not following a sound soil conservation program.
