

# 3 Conservation Scholarships Open To Teachers

Three scholarships to the Iowa Teachers Conservation Camp held annually at Springbrook Park near Guthrie Center are available, according to Dean Kelsey, Chairman of the Hardin Soil Conservation District and C. O. Rubow, Secretary of the Pine Lake Wildlife Club.

The two organizations annually sponsor teachers to attend the conservation camp. A teacher may choose to go to any of three sessions and earn three semester hours of college credit. The first session will begin June 8, the second on June 29 and the third on July 20,

The camp is a regular college course but differs in that a major portion of the instruction is done in the field. Most of the field instruction is done by guest specialists from various state and federal agencies. These field trips aid the teachers in learning conservation by observing natural resources and seeing the actual conservation practices put into use.

Modern facilities and recreational opportunities give this summer school a vacation-like atmosphere. Fishing, swimming and boating may be enjoyed on the 27 acre lake. Visitors are welcome and there are picnic facilities available to them.

Tuition for each session is \$36.00 for undergraduates and \$42.00 for graduates. Other expenses for those attending include \$58.54 for board and room.
