

Dr. Browning Will Speak At Second Soil School Wed.

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Dr. George Browning, associate director of the Iowa State College experimental station, will be the principal speaker at next week's session of the soil conservation school in Bloomfield. The session will be one of four being sponsored by the Davis County Soil Conservation District.

The all-day meeting will be held at the community hall Wednesday, February 2, beginning with coffee at 9:30 a.m. The program will get underway at 10:00 and will feature films and the development of a farm conservation plan. The problem of fitting rotation and fields to match the capabilities of the land will also be included among the topics. A short discussion will be held at the close of the morning period on supporting conservation practices.

Dr. Browning will address the afternoon portion of the session, due to begin at 1:00. He will provide the latest information on crop rotation, soil treatment and new variations of crops. He is also expected to report on research trends in other parts of the state.

All farmers and landowners are invited and urged to attend the session.
