

Across the highway from Mr. S. S. Beaman's farm is one owned by

GEORGE MONEY,

Containing about three hundred acres of nice arable land, with native woodland enough for use on the farm, and also enough for use in the future. There are ten acres of orchard and 5000 evergreens, of every variety that will grow in this latitude, cover five acres of ground.

One of our most enterprising farmers, Mr. Money has spent a great deal of time and money in growing a thrifty orchard, and in improving his place. In small fruits there is the greatest abundance, especially strawberries. Eighty acres of flax was sown, but on account of the drouth and being "put in" a little too late, the crop was a failure.

Mr. Money owns twenty head of horses and mules, has a hundred head of swine, and in other products Glen Oak farm is one of the best on Wolf Creek. The buildings at Glen Oak are plain but substantial; the fences are first class, and Mr. Money both in the Grange and M. E. Church, is counted as an influential member.
