

Agriculture Pupils In Soil Judging Contest On Friday

A soil judging contest open to all vocational agriculture departments in Hardin county will be held Friday, Oct. 24 at the Al Albers farm east of Owasa.

The contest, sponsored by the Hardin Soil Conservation District, will start at 9 a.m. and will be open for the participating schools all during the day.

Each student will judge three soil profiles with the four highest scorers from each school constituting a team. The school with highest team score will be presented a plaque as winner of the contest. Individual awards will be presented to the high scorer of each participating school.

Seven schools of Hardin county currently have Vocational Agriculture departments. They are: Ackley, Alden, Eldora, Hubbard, Iowa Falls, New Providence and Radcliffe.
