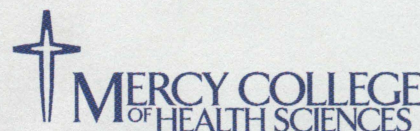

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DR. REMER RESIGNS AS PRESIDENT AFTER 15 YEARS BARBARA QUIJANO DECKER NAMED INTERIM PRESIDENT

DR. DEANNE REMER, Mercy College President, announced her resignation on October 3, 2005 to take effect on October 15, 2005. The College Board of Directors will launch a national search to find a permanent replacement in time for the 2006-07 academic year.

In the meantime, **BARBARA QUIJANO DECKER** has been named Interim President by the Executive Committee of the Mercy College Board of Directors. Ms. Quijano Decker has

temporarily left her position as Administrator of the Human Resources Department of Mercy Medical Center -- Des Moines to assume the interim position.

A welcome reception for Ms. Quijano Decker will be held on Monday, October 24, 2005 from 3:30 to 5:30 p.m. in the lobby of Building 1. Students, staff and medical center personnel are invited to attend the event to meet Ms. Decker.

SULLIVAN CENTER OFFICIALLY OPENS

THE PATRICIA CLARE SULLIVAN CENTER officially opened for public use on Friday, October 7, 2005 with the relocation of the College Receptionist -- Missy Chapman -- from Building 1 to the new building.

The College Library is scheduled to be relocated on Friday, October 14. During the library move -- which is scheduled for the same day as the faculty in-service -- limited library services will be operated from Room 128 in Brennan Hall. The library will re-open for patron access on Saturday, October 15.

The current library in Brennan Hall is scheduled to be converted into a classroom for the spring 2006 semester.

STUDENT PARKING AS CONSTRUCTION END NEARS

STUDENTS ARE REMINDED to park in the 701 Crocker Street Parking Lot when attending class or clinical sessions off campus. When the lot is full, overflow parking is available at the Park & Ride Garage directly south of the College -- at College expense. Bring your parking pass to the receptionist to have it stamped before returning to claim your car. After 5 p.m., you can have your ticket stamped in the library.

Enrolled students are prohibited from parking in the Staff Parking Lot located next to Building 2 or in the Visitor Parking Lot north of the Sullivan Center. Failure to follow parking restrictions will result in tickets or towing at the violator's expense.

Students living at Mercy Court and Student Services staff are the only members of the campus community allowed to park at Mercy Court.
