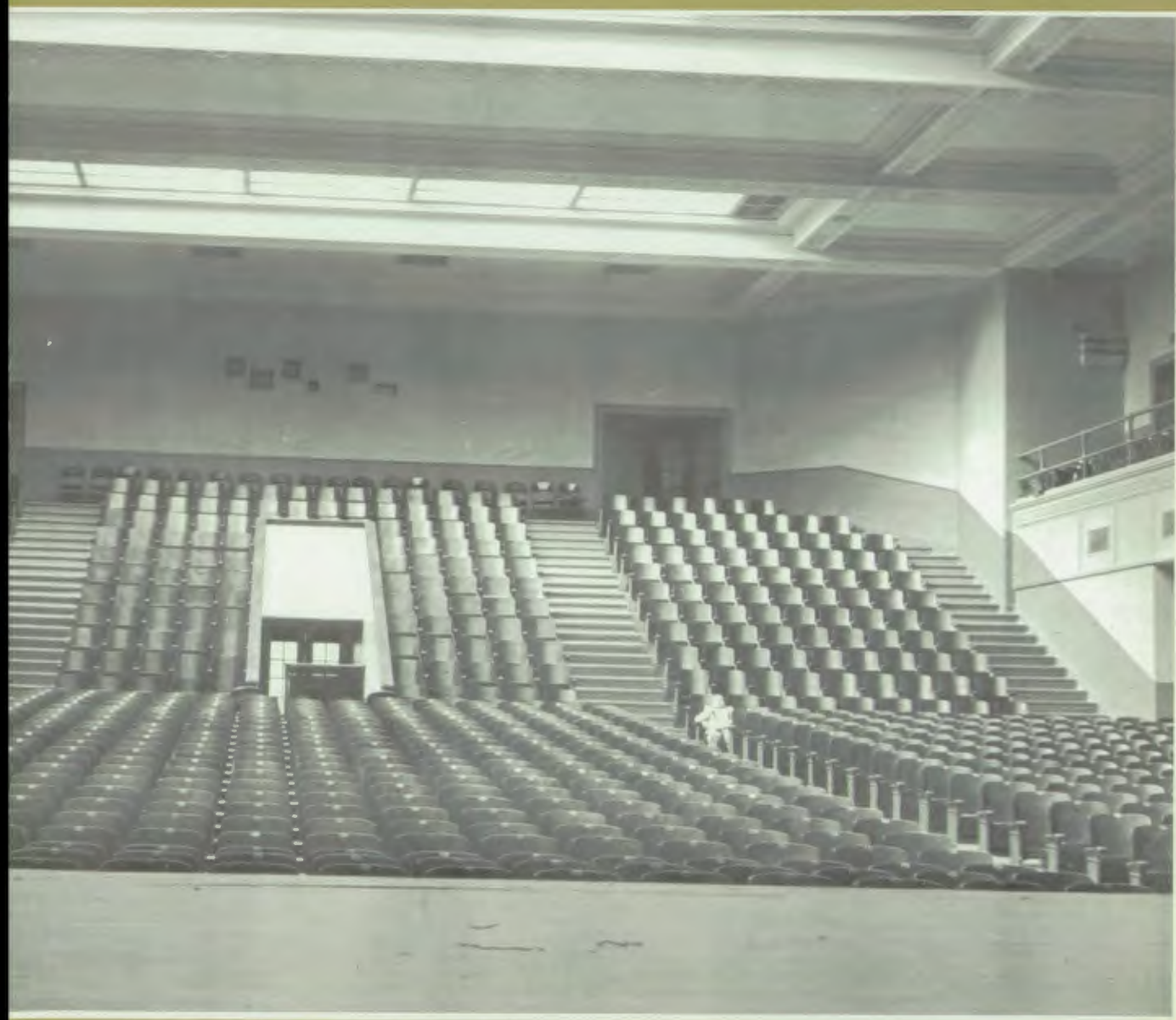


The epitome of student leadership is embodied in the OHS Student Council. This year's honorary Student Council member, Leila Losi, is our foreign exchange student from Italy.

Dr. McKenna has had wide experience in the field of education. He earned his Bachelor of Education Degree from Wisconsin State College, and received his M.S. Degree from the University of Wisconsin. Following seven years of teaching and coaching on the senior high school level, he served 14 years as a superintendent of schools in Wisconsin.

In 1964, Dr. McKenna became a student at the University of Iowa, where he earned his Ph.D. before coming to Ottumwa to serve in his present capacity.

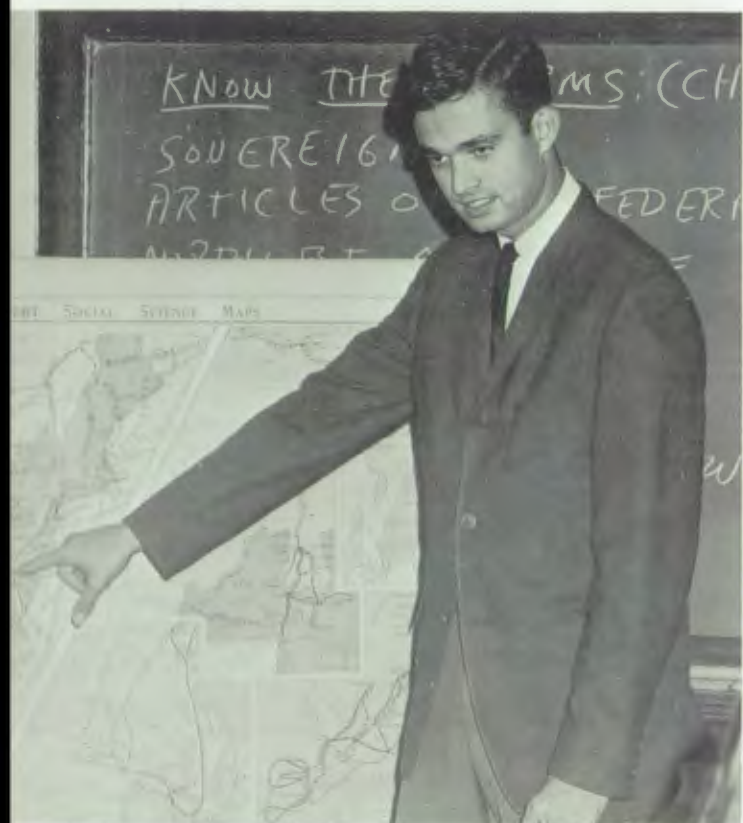

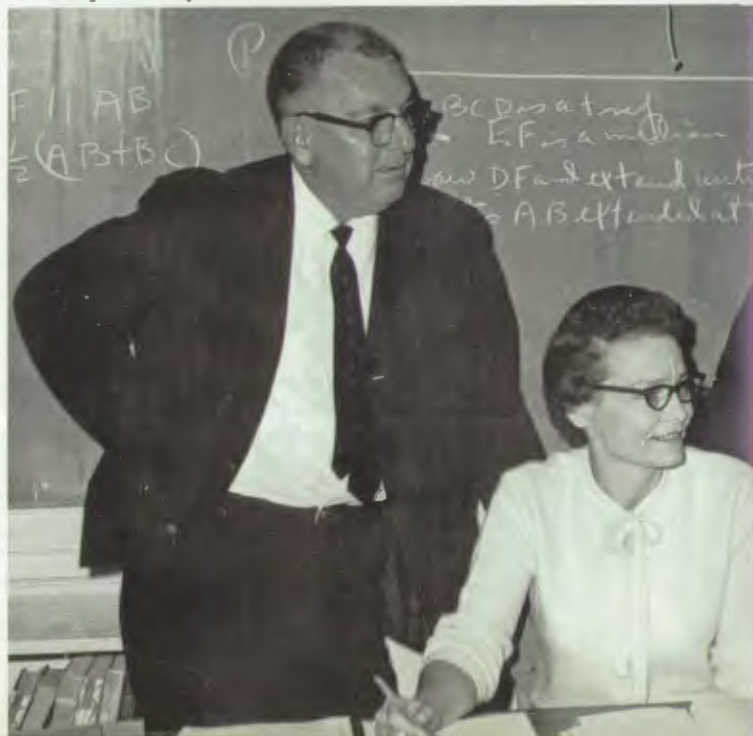

But, more important, you work in high school English classes toward three very high goals: (1) improving your ability to organize and clarify your thinking; (2) increasing your understanding of the vast variety and complexities of human personality; and (3) developing some ideas about what is most significant in man's life.

You work toward the first goal in written and oral composition. It is always difficult to gather ideas, to sift them, and to make them clear to others. When you succeed, there is satisfaction in your work. And its importance to the theme of this year's Argus—developing leadership—is obvious.

You work toward the second and third goals through reading books, all kinds of books, the more the better. Through discussion of your reading your teachers try to develop in you some insight into human motives and the beginnings of a philosophy. Biology, one of the oldest sciences in the world, is the study of living beings. Science teachers in this area stress a greater awareness of nature.

The "how" and "why" of the non-living world is explored in the physics classes, where the laws of matter and energy are studied. Substance changes and transformations are dealt with in more depth in chemistry classes. By performing laboratory experiments, students gain a better understanding of chemical compounds and elements.

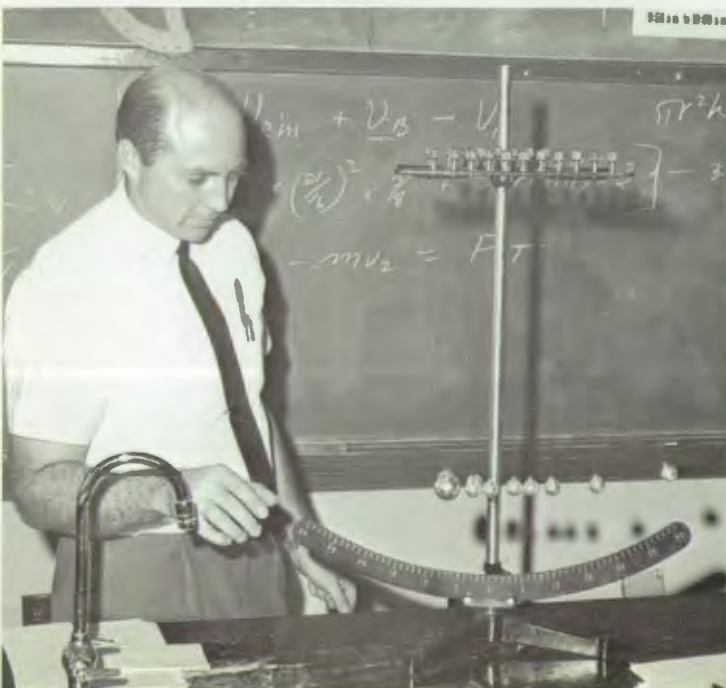

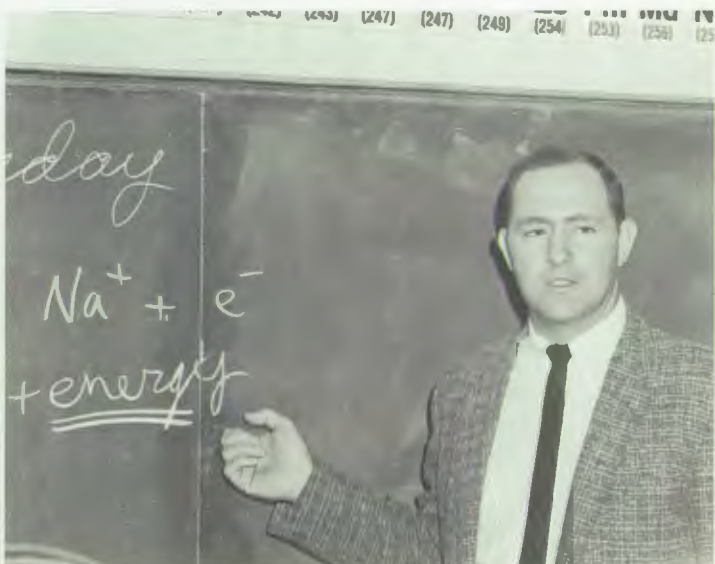

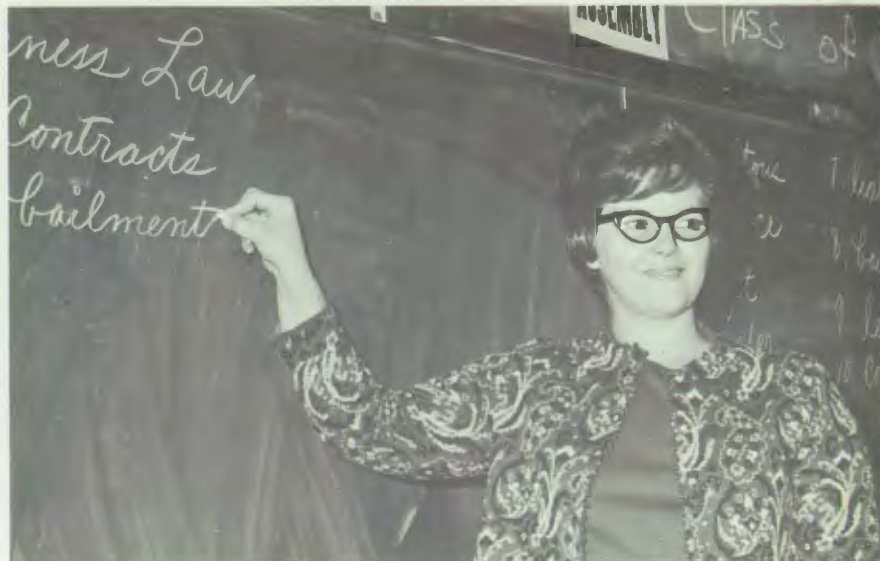

Students Prepare for Home and Business Life

Home Economics.

Making clothes, cooking food, learning child care, and designing a home are just a few of the skills being taught in the Home Economics Department at Ottumwa High School. By offering students such a variety of courses, the Home Economics Department prepares high school students for their role as successful homemakers of the future.

Business Classes.

Business courses at Ottumwa High School provide students with sound qualifications for future employment.

While advanced typing classes stress accuracy, speed, and competence, the beginner classes concentrate on the basic fundamentals of typing. The importance of correct spelling and punctuation is emphasized in shorthand classes. After learning the shorthand alphabet, students who wish to may take Stenography II, where they learn to operate such office machines as the mimeoscope, duplicator, and stencil.

The office education classes combine bookkeeping, shorthand, and typing with on-the-job secretarial work; students in the distributive education program attend classes for just half a day and hold part-time jobs, where they apply their business training.

Keyword of Industrial Arts is Individuality

Industrial Education today is playing a much greater part in the American economy than at any other time. To keep the economic growth moving forward the country needs men prepared to not only lead other men, but to do the numerous technical tasks when called upon. The curriculum of the Industrial Arts Department is designed to give those students capable of meeting the demands of industry the start they need to fulfill the demand.

Industrial arts education is highly individualized. The pride an individual has in achieving something with raw material brings out the best there is in man and captures the learner's attention and enriches his concepts.

Each student is permitted to progress as rapidly and as deeply in his field of study as his ability and interests allow. For example, a student studying drafting, if permitted to exert himself to the greatest extent of his capabilities, might create something new and thus get a "running start" in his profession. After designing a house, completing the floor plan, drawing elevation and pictorial view, and making the model, a student has a better concept of the building trade. Drawing or expressing one's idea in graphic form is basic to all industrial arts activities and is another form of human communication. If a person can learn to work with others, work for others, and communicate his thoughts and ideas, he is sure to become a leader in any industry.

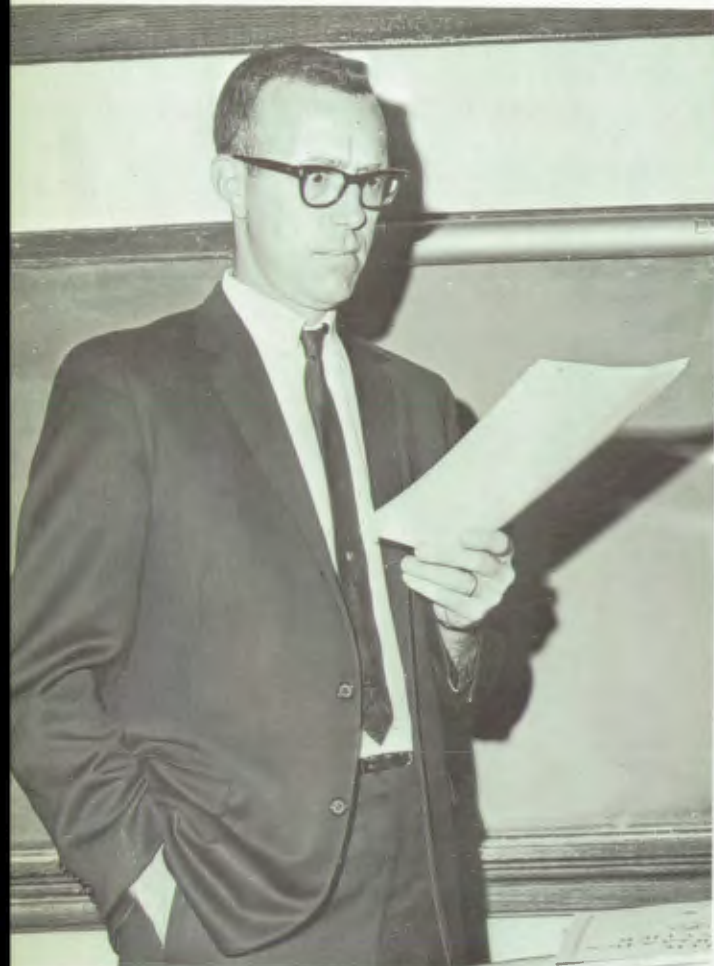

Ottumwa's Long Season

Any time a football team loses all its games it will surely pick up many critics. Perhaps the most profound critical observation of the 1966 Bulldogs is that a significant block to success was the order of the schedule.

After facing three of Iowa's toughest football teams in their opening games, the Bulldogs faltered. In the opening game with Newton the Bulldogs nearly upset the Iowa Conference powerhouse of Newton. With only four minutes left a costly penalty gave Newton new life, and they went on to win the game. Next the Bulldogs battled the Mount Pleasant Panthers on even terms only to lose in the last quarter. Bettendorf's powerhouse outlasted the Bulldogs' in a high-scoring game which saw the Bulldogs' scoring machine at the peak of its proficiency.

Then the roof fell in.

The Bulldogs, though they had played three excellent games, were beset with injuries, and simply could not pick themselves up to challenge seriously the teams in the rugged Little Six Conference.

Perhaps if the schedule could have been reversed the undesirable record would have been different. Though this argument is purely academic, it seems reasonable in light of the way the Bulldogs played throughout the season.

No one is more keenly aware of the ocean of frustration of the Bulldogs than Coach Bob Vander Linden.

Dennis Dougherty wrote his name in the record books of Ottumwa High School when he ran 86 yards from scrimmage against the Burlington Greyhounds. Then, too, fans will remember the hard running of Mike Weirbach and the broken field antics of junior back Bill Wall. Outstanding linemen for the '66 Bulldogs include Richard Stearns and Greg Guiter. Guiter was named to the all Little Six first team.

Success was short-lived, however, as the Bulldogs were unable to hold the lead in games and fell victim to last quarter slumps.

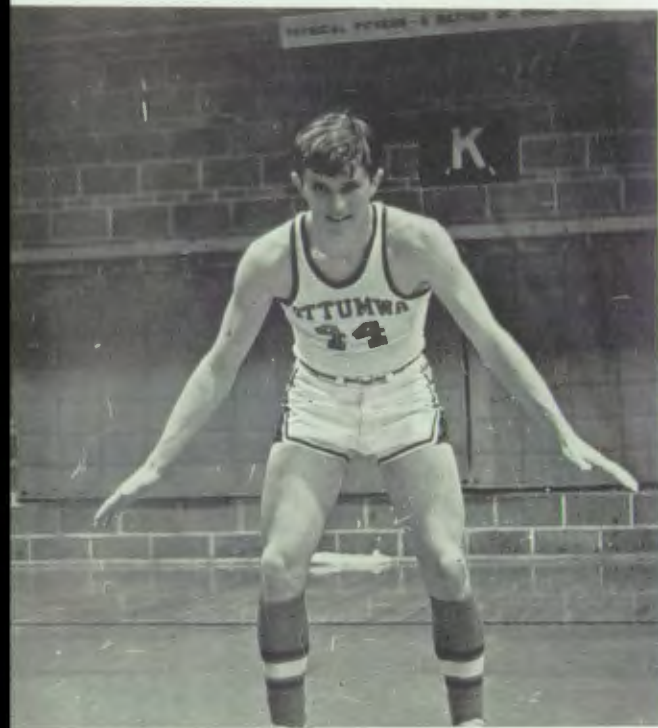
The 3-17 won-lost record posted by the Bulldogs during the regular season will more than likely be improved next year since Coach Kramer used a predominately junior team.

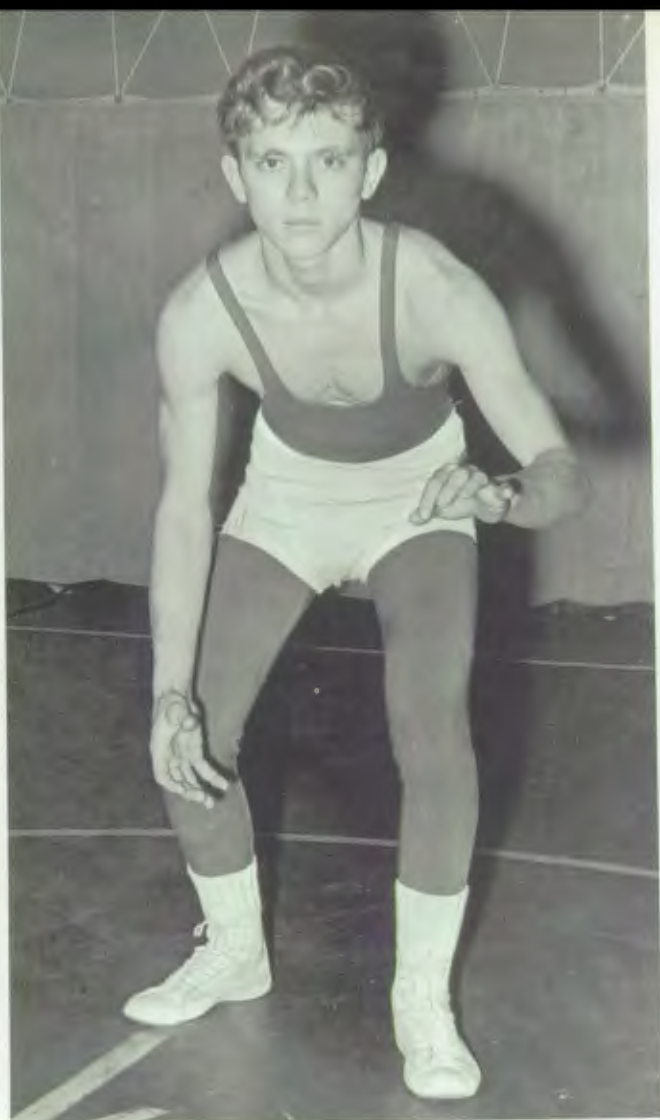

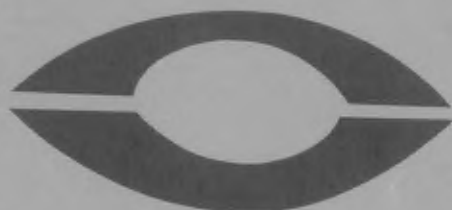
Hard workouts, interest, and determination sped the sophomores to victory. Team work and individual effort have helped break many records and increase the desire to do better.

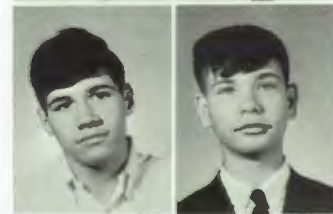

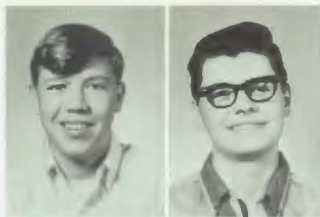

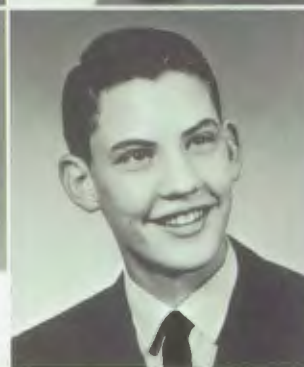

Veta Adjusts to Life in Germany

One of my German friends was reading the notes students had written in my *Argus Annual* and after a while she said astonished, "They write as if Germany is the world's end!" Today Germany seems like home and it is strange to think that a year ago it was a far away land with odd customs, and Essen was a city of which I had never heard.

At first everything was new, different, exciting, and sometimes bewildering. For example, one day not long after my arrival, I heard the doorbell and looked downstairs to see who had come. But I quickly retreated to my room a little frightened as I saw a man coming up the stairs dressed in black, wearing a stovepipe hat and carrying queer black instruments. I later realized it was a chimney sweep. It was strange at first to eat dinner, which always includes potatoes, at two o'clock when I came home from school. Eating with the knife in the right hand and the fork in the left, having fruit for dessert, and then eating cake at "kaffee" later in the afternoon were new habits I had to acquire. Sometimes I felt like a small child learning its first manners. To greet someone you know, you shake hands. If it is a person your parents' age or older, and you yourself are about eighteen years or younger, then you half curtsy as you shake hands if you are a girl, and bow if you are a boy. When you say good-bye, you shake hands again. It was not too hard to learn most of the customs. When the exchange students in my area met after four months, although we were all Americans we greeted each other with a handshake and "Guten Tag! Wie geht's dir?"

Recently I received a letter which referred to my year abroad as a "wonderful experience." My first thought was, "I wonder if she would call it a 'wonderful experience' if she knew that my life is just that of an ordinary German girl." Then I realized of course that was exactly what made it wonderful—that it is a normal life, that it is not strange for me to walk along the Ruhr, to almost always carry an umbrella in case it rains, to go to an all girls' school, or to speak German. In fact, what really makes it a wonderful experience is that now Germany no longer seems at the world's end, but is as real and near as the U.S.

In spite of having been here only three months, and even though language differences have hindered my knowing and learning much more than I have, I have been able to observe that the way of life of the people of this country is very different from that of the majority of Latin American countries.

I think the difference is due to one main factor: the overwhelming advancements and conveniences people of this country have at their disposal. The same thing does not occur in most other nations; for example, most of the young people here are able to own cars, to go to the show, to go to dances, etc., without too great a difficulty in having money to buy them. In Argentina, an automobile costs twice as much as one here; obviously, therefore, it is very difficult to buy one. Examples and reasons such as these create vast differences in school as well as in the home.

With respect to the life of young people, the truth is that it, likewise, is very different in every aspect. In Argentina, young people have other ways of enjoying themselves and spending their time, which I personally prefer of course, since I come from there.

I have found Ottumwa to be a very fine city and the people in general very good. I see no reason why any foreign exchange student such as myself, should have any complaints at all on this topic.

At this point, there only remains for me to express my many thanks to everybody for their hospitality and for the kindness and considerate help all have given me.

In July 1966 when I was accepted as an A.F.S. student, I jumped three feet high for happiness. I am sorry to admit that at first I did not even know there was a state in the United States called Iowa. Now, however, I could write a book about Iowa.
