Former Contractor, Recalls Highlights of Interesting Career

Almost a century - Ed Ackerson, 321 Walnut Street, Cedar Falls, Iowa will soon celebrate his 96th birthday. Ed was born Sept. 17, 1860, in New Hartford, then a village of three houses. He has lived most of his life in this area.

I spent two interesting hours yesterday visiting with one of our livliest elders. He is 96 years old, Ed Ackerson of 321 Walnut Street, who lives alone, but rents out half of his house. His only companion was his dog, Mickey, which he has had for several years. Ed doesn't know exactly just when he was born, but he does know that his birthday is Sept. 17. I feel as good today as I did when I was 25 years old.

Ed has lived most of his life in the Cedar Falls area, but was born in New Hartford. At that time the village of New Hartford had only three houses _____ . This kept the houses cool in the summer and warm in the winter _____. Ed's father David Ackerson came to the area from Illinois _____.

Ed told me of one time when about 300 Indians were coming down the wagon trail toward their house while his father was away. His mother grabbed an ax and locked all the windows and stood behind the door ready to hit the first Indian who came through. "She was ready for War." Luckily he chuckled, "they didn't come in but kept on going down the road."

Ed had been a contractor in Cedar Falls for 50 years before his retirement many years ago. "Having no work is what ails me today." Ed told me "The wages they pay today are much too high." He said "When I was in the contracting business the most I ever earned was \$3 a day." As we were on the front porch of Ed's house he pointed out perhaps a dozen houses that he had constructed in the vicinity. He built many large houses in the area also. Ed told me that he got a kick out of seeing houses that he had build being remodeled over and over again.

"I've even out lived some of the houses," he chuckled. Ed remembers the Iowa State Teachers College as just a soldiers house. "They had some kids in school up there and _____ of soldiers all over the place.

"The longest trip I've ever taken was one when I went to the Black Hills with our daughter Lora Casey. She was the owner of Casey Beauty Shop. My wife Elizabeth died many years ago.

Ed chuckled and told me about a man who came to Cedar Falls the same time he did and built a house across the street from him.

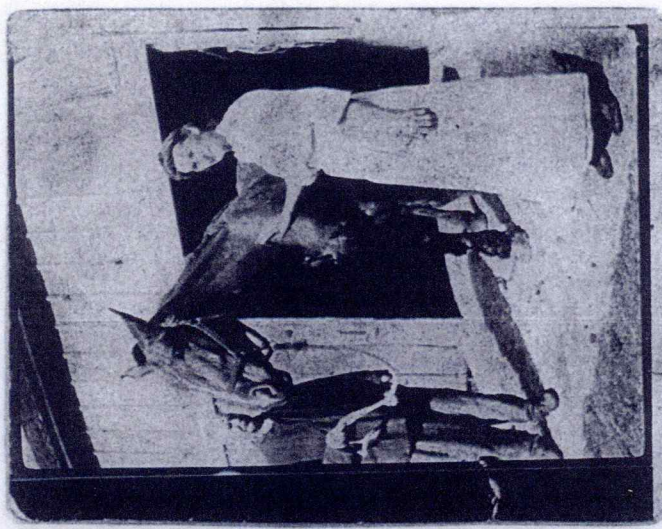
