Milo Olsons Observe Silver Anniversary

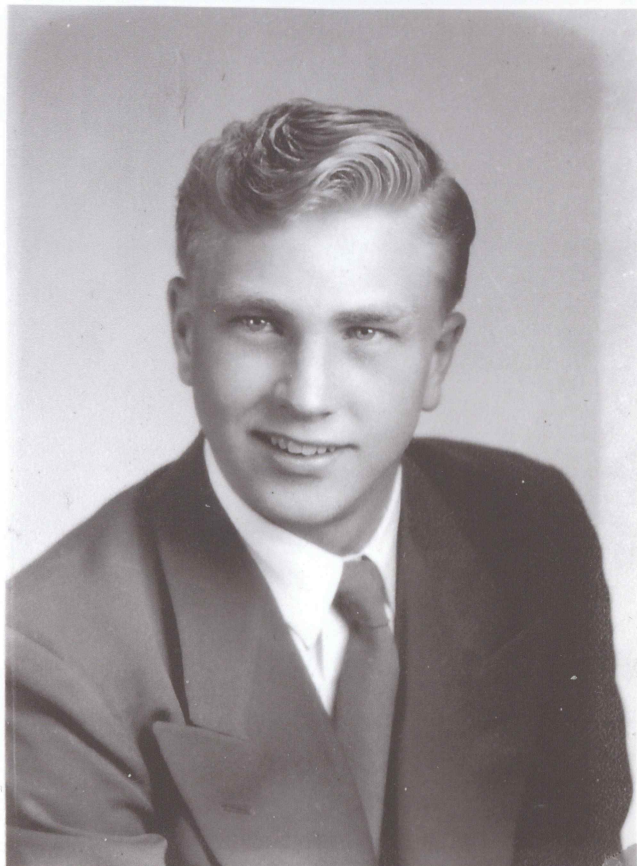
