

Iowa and Cedar River cresting again

The high-water of the Iowa and the Cedar Rivers have left no where for weekend rains to go. Spokesman for the Army Corps of Engineers at Coralville said the situation does not look particularly good. "We can expect some trouble down stream particularly if we get any additional rainfall before Thursday," said Marvin Atkins. "The pool increased a foot Monday and we expect more as the water upstream reaches us over the next couple of days" The corps increased the outflow of the reservoir to 15,500 cubic feet per second. The Iowa River at Lone Tree is expected to crest Thursday and Cedar River at Conesville will crest Friday.
