Howard Vint, Marshall county club agent since May, 1942, has volunteered for induction thru the Cherokee county selective board where he is registered and this week was accepted for duty with the air corps.

He is awaiting orders which are expected early in the year. In the meantime, discussion of the vacancy resulting from his action will await a farm bureau board meeting scheduled for next week, officials said. Whether an attempt will be made to fill the place will depend, it was indicated, on the availability of a suitable wartime successor.

Vint, who is the son of Mr. and Mrs. Emil Vint of Beaman, is married and has two children. He came to Marshall county from Scott county where he had been a successful club agent and prior to that had been located in Cherokee county.

His club leadership here, over a period when war's impact on agriculture was being felt in youth activity as well as in other phases of the industry, has brought some very creditable results. The 1944 program is well under way and regardless of action taken by the board next week, will be continued it was indicated Friday.
