COMBAT HUNGER AND SHOES THAT FIT: OPPORTUNITIES TO BRIGHTEN SOMEONE'S HOLIDAYS

OVER THE NEXT FEW WEEKS, Mercy Medical Center will have two exceptional Mission on the Move opportunities—**COMBAT HUNGER** and **SHOES THAT FIT**. Both activities center on making the holidays a bit brighter for those in need.

OPPORTUNITY #1 - COMBAT HUNGER will be the first effort. Through this project, Mercy has partnered with The Des Moines Register, MTA, Dahl's Foods, the Iowa Motor Truck Association and STAR 102.5 to help the Food Bank of Iowa provide food for more than 270,000 Central Iowans who struggle to meet their needs.

There are a few ways that you can help with Combat Hunger.

HERE ARE THE OPTIONS:

- We will be collecting non-perishable food items beginning Monday, November 14. Our goal is to reach 20,000 pounds of food. Each food item donated equals one pound and every dollar donated equals two pounds. Items needed include: non-perishable foods (i.e. boxed meals, cold cereal, 100% fruit juice, any canned foods), paper products (i.e., paper towels, plates, toilet paper and tissues), diapers and baby wipes.
- Do you know your way around Mercy? If so, we need people who are willing to wheel around and collect food from the departments on 11/17 and 11/18. We will load donations on to trucks bound for the Food Bank.
- Do you prefer being out and about? We need volunteers to collect food at the 11 Dahl's locations on Thursday, November 17 and Friday, November 18. Shifts will be from 7 a.m. to 10 a.m., 10 a.m. to 1 p.m., 1 p.m. to 4 p.m. and 3 p.m. to 7 p.m.

OPPORTUNITY #2 - SHOES THAT FIT

The Mercy Family has often gathered to assist families in crisis. This year, we will join with the community to identify elementary students in local schools with clothing needs.

Last year, Shoes That Fit filled the needs of more than 6,200 children in 32 elementary schools. This year, Mercy is one of 14 area businesses that will participate in the fourth annual campaign.

HERE'S HOW IT WORKS

Mediacom, our fellow sponsor, has made their way to area schools collecting "needs cards" for children. These cards contain a description of the one needed clothing item, size, gender of child, and age. The "needs card" will be distributed to those who are interested in purchasing an item for that particular child.

HOW YOU CAN HELP:

- At Mercy's Central Campus, any Mercy employee or department interested in obtaining a child's "needs card" should stop by the PR & Marketing, A-Level, between 8 a.m. and 4:30 p.m. through Dec. 15. After fulfilling the card, items may be dropped off in PR/Marketing.
- Donations of money are always welcome. The checks can be made out to Shoes That Fit. All cash and checks can be returned to PR & Marketing by Dec. 15.

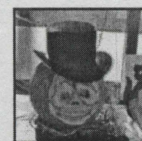

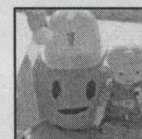

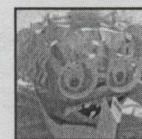
Last week you may have noticed a display of decorated pumpkins in the Sullivan Center. Each college division decorated three pumpkins.

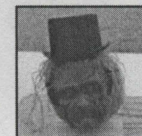
