Groth, pastor of the German Lutheran church. The wedding was a large home affair, the ceremony being witnessed by over 150 of the bride's relatives and friends. Mr. and Mrs. Fischer will leave Tuesday for Fort Collins, where he is connected with the Ft. Collins Packing Co.

Mr. and Mrs. F. A. Hilleman have issued invitations for the marriage of their eldest daughter Ida to Ernest Fischer, of Ft. Collins, which will occur at their home Wednesday evening, June 7, at 7 o'clock. A few days after the wedding Mr. and Mrs. Fischer will leave for Ft. Collins, where he is associated with the Ft. Collins Packing Co.

The bride was daintily attired in white China silk and carried a small bouquet of roses.

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MRS. ERNEST FISCHER PASSES SUDDENLY

Word was received here Monday of the sudden death of Mrs. Ernest Fischer, 62, a former resident of the State Center community at her home at Fort Collins, Colorado. Death came as a result of a cerebral hemorrhage. Mrs. Fischer, who is a sister of Harvey Hilleman and W. C. Hilleman of this city, had not been ill. She was the daughter of the late Fred and Marie Hilleman.

Besides her brothers here, she is survived by her husband, one daughter, Gertrude, and three sons, George, Elmer and James, all of Fort Collins, and one sister, Mrs. A. W. West of Fort Collins.

Funeral services are being held at 2:30 p.m. today at Fort Collins with interment in the cemetery there. Mr. and Mrs. W. C. Hilleman and Mr. and Mrs. August Eggers left by train Tuesday to attend the services.

Mr. and Mrs. W. C. Hilleman returned home Friday from Fort Collins, Colo., where they had been called before Christmas by the sudden death of the former's sister, Mrs. Ernest Fischer, who passed away, Dec. 20 from a cerebral hemorrhage. The Hilleman's were delayed in their return by the severe storm which struck the west the past week. While at Fort Collins they visited Mrs. Hilleman's sister, Mrs. Marie Fischer and also Mr. and Mrs. A. W. West.

Dinner Will Honor Ernest Fischer, 80

Ernest Fischer, "grand old man" of Larimer county politics, is 80 years old Sunday.

The day will be marked by a quiet family gathering at the home of a son, James H. Fischer, who with his wife Virginia and their two youngsters, Denny and Jimmy, will play host at a turkey dinner to other members of the Fischer family.

A daughter, Miss Gertrude Fischer, another son, George E. Fischer, his wife Helen and their daughters, Lucinda and Gretchen, will complete the family fold for the four-score celebration.

A third son, Elmer Fischer of Denver, and his family paid their birthday respects a week early since it is impossible for them to be here for the birthday dinner.

Will Get Picture

The highlight of the day for the veteran Republican County Commissioner will be the unveiling of a large colored picture of Larimer county's \$1.5 million Courthouse, the family's present to Mr. Fischer. "The new Courthouse fulfills his fondest dreams," said Mrs. James Fischer. "We know of nothing that is certain to please him more than the picture."

That the Courthouse should occupy a prominent place in the heart of Mr. Fischer is no surprise. He has, in the opinion of many, both Republicans and Democrats, served the county with high competence, honesty and vision. First elected commissioner in November 1938, Mr. Fischer will conclude 20 years of county service with his retirement at the end of this year. Mr. Fischer has announced he will not seek reelection.

As commissioner of District 1,

which extends northwest of Fort Collins and includes Rist Canyon and the Laramie River section, Mr. Fischer has seen the county's total budget grow from less than \$2 million in 1938 to more than \$4 million in 1958.

"At one time the main function of a commissioner was to try to make a man happy by providing his home area with good roads," said Mr. Fischer. "Now the office requires considerable time, think-

ing and energy for matters of health, education and welfare as well as roads.

No one knows better the time-consuming elements of a County Commissioner's job than does Mr. Fischer. Even before his retirement from the Fischer market business in 1952, he was spending virtually his entire working day at his Courthouse desk, seeing at first hand the multiplicity of chores to be done in his vast district.

Went in Person

An associate of Mr. Fischer once said, "Mr. Fischer was never one to depend on the phone or someone else's word about many county matters. He would take time to investigate problems on the spot before he would make a decision."

Born near Hanover, Germany, April 27, 1878, Mr. Fischer came to America as a boy of 16 in 1894. He moved to Fort Collins in 1898 and went to work in a meat market. Fifty-four years later he announced that the Fischer & Sons market at 126 West Mountain Avenue would close.

Mr. Fischer lives with his daughter, Miss Gertrude Fischer, at 319 South Grant Street. His wife died in 1948.

Ernest Fischer Dies Here at 80

Ernest Fischer, who retired in January after 20 years as a Larimer county commissioner, died of a heart attack Saturday morning. He would have been 81 next month.

Death came to the "grand old man" of Larimer county politics at 6:30 a.m. at his residence at 319 South Grant Street. His daughter, Miss Gertrude Fischer, was with him at the time.

In failing health for more than a year, Mr. Fischer has been almost bedfast since last November. He announced six months prior to the 1938 elections that he would not again seek the post he held for five terms.

Lowell M. Allen, his successor, calls Mr. Fischer's death a great loss, hailing Mr. Fischer as "one of the finest men I've ever known, a great public servant. It is difficult to lose a man of his caliber."

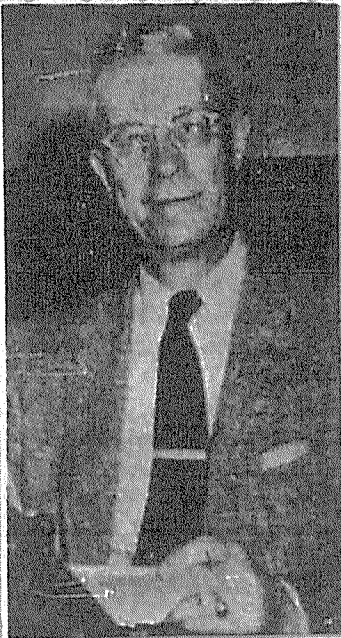
Funeral Tuesday

The funeral will be held at 2:30 p.m. Tuesday at St. John's Lutheran Church, with the Rev. John Hennig in charge. Burial will be at Grandview cemetery. The Warren Funeral Chapel is in charge of arrangements.

Robert H. Watts, commissioners' chairman, announced Saturday that all Courthouse offices, except the sheriff's and clerk's offices, will be closed from 2 p.m. for the remainder of the business day Tuesday.

Mr. Watts paid tribute to Mr. Fischer, one of the most highly regarded officials in the county's history. His always careful and conscientious attention to the taxpayer's dollar and his willingness to listen to any resident having questions or complaints endeared him to all who knew him.

Another commissioner, A. Walter Lawson, was on his way to Arizona at the time of Mr. Fischer's death.

Leaves Four Children

Besides his daughter, Miss Gertrude, Mr. Fischer is survived by three sons, Elmer of Denver, George E. and James H. of Fort Collins. Five grandchildren are numbered in the Fischer family, Freddie, Lucinda Lynn, Gretchen Owen, James Leigh and Dennis Glen.

Mr. Fischer is survived also by a step-brother, William Seeger of State Center, Iowa. Mr. Fischer's wife preceded him in death on Dec. 20, 1948.

A quiet family celebration last April 27, marking Mr. Fischer's 80th birthday, was highlighted by a presentation to him by his daughter and sons of a large colored picture of Larimer county's \$1.5 million Courthouse. The paid-for-structure was believed by Mr. Fischer to be one of the greatest achievements of his 20 years in office.

Mr. Fischer was born of humble parents in Volksen, a small village in Germany, April 27, 1878. At the age of 16 he chose America as the country where he wanted to spend the rest of his life. He came to this country in 1894, settling first in Iowa. Four years later he selected Fort Collins as his residence and lived here continuously since.

Active in Church

Mr. Fischer was baptized as an infant and confirmed at the age of 14 in the Lutheran Church. He attended elementary church schools in Germany and in this country. He continued his work in the Lutheran Church, serving as treasurer of St. John's Lutheran Church for 23 years, and participating in its growth to its present location and size.

On June 5, 1905, Mr. Fischer married Miss Ida Hilleman. In 1898, when he came to Colorado, he engaged in the retail meat business, including cattle and sheep feeding operations. Fifty-four years later he announced that the Fischer & Sons market at 126 West Mountain Avenue would close.

Elected in 1938

First elected a county commissioner in November 1938, Mr. Fischer served continuously in that office for 20 years, and was the board's chairman or vice chairman for many of those years. As commissioner of District 1, which extends northwest of Fort Collins and includes Hist Canyon and the Larimer River section, Mr. Fischer saw the county's budget grow from less than \$2 million in 1939 to more than \$4 million in 1958.

Numerous civic and community-building organizations have received his support, including the Chamber of Commerce, hospital, welfare, health and road building projects.

Ernest Fischer Dies In Colo.

Wilbert C. Hilleman of State Center received word last Saturday morning of the death of Ernest Fischer 80, a frequent visitor here, at his home in Fort Collins, Colorado. Funeral services were held at Fort Collins on Tuesday.

Mr. Fischer, who had served as county commissioner for more than 20 years, was a brother-in-law of Mr. Hilleman and the late Harvey Hilleman. William Seeger is a half brother of Mr. Fischer.
